While we continue to have in-person worship, we are now implementing the following COVID guidelines due to the recent surge in Delta variant cases:

- Wearing of masks in worship
- Use of hand sanitizer upon entering church
- Engage in physical distancing
- Hymns sung by designated singers; congregation, hum or sing softly
- No physical sharing of the peace
- Discontinue the coffee hour fellowship fellowship outside as desired

• Haiti Crisis: On August 14, a devastating 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck southwest Haiti. Over 2,100 people were killed, thousands more were injured, and more than 26,000 homes were damaged or destroyed. Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with partner organizations in the communities to provide food, nonfood items, and temporary shelter. Other areas of support include psychosocial care, water and sanitation, and creating sustainable livelihoods through agriculture and livestock. Your gifts will support earthquake survivors. Gifts to "Haiti Crisis" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by the earthquake until the response is complete. To help support relief efforts, you may write a check to St. Paul Lutheran, designate "Haiti Crisis" on the memo line, and drop the check in the offering plate or mail it to the church. Thank you.

About 270 children came to the church for clothes – many more than last year! The boxes of clothing left over were taken to Family Resource Centers in various schools where they will be distributed to kids in need. Approximately 150 more children will get clothes and shoes at their schools.

Thank you to more than 30 people who volunteered MANY hours to carry out this event. Special thank yous go to Sheila Gray for shopping for most of the clothes, Vicke Schend for purchasing the shoes, Debbie Allison & Sharon Tandberg for handling online grant applications, Karen Sitte who handled the money & bookkeeping and Elaine Ryan who helped with the bulletin & newsletter notices.
