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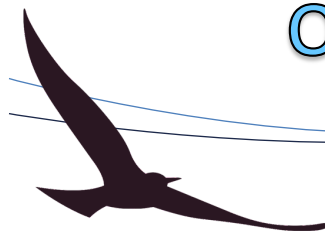

## Bishop Trevor Edwards

Dear Friends,

Today is Mother's Day in our society when we traditionally give thanks for one of the people who was humanly responsible for giving us life and in many cases nurturing us while we were young.

Originally of course there was a Sunday in the church calendar called Mothering Sunday, but it has been swallowed up by another mid-nineteenth century American concept. In my opinion this day has regrettably become a multimillion dollar commercial enterprise in our culture, and a far cry from a plan to commemorate motherhood by calling women to unite against war and in favour of disarmament! As a result, Ruth and I tried to gently protest against its commercialisation by teaching teach our children that every day should be a mother's day and not just wait for an annual celebration.

A London editor once submitted a list to Winston Churchill for his approval of all those who had been his teachers. Churchill returned the list with one correction: "You have omitted to mention the greatest of my teachers – my mother". I too learned many valuable things from my mother and owe her a debt of gratitude for her patient, loving care and instruction as I grew to maturity, but with great respect to Churchill there is a greater teacher.

We are coming to the end of the Easter season and approaching Pentecost Sunday. In these seasons we specifically remember the death and resurrection of Jesus and his parting gift of the Holy Spirit. My mother and I came to genuine faith in Jesus at the same time. It was God's Spirit who spiritually speaking enabled us both to respond to the gospel and be born again. We then discovered he was the greatest of all our teachers because as we read our Bibles he led us into all truth about God and promised to bring us to eternal glory in the image of Christ. My mother, no matter how gifted she was, could never do that and she knew it. So while I remain extremely grateful for her love and example, she and I are eternally grateful for God's gift to us which came without any cost to us even though it cost God his all.

**Bible Readings**

*for today's Bible messages*

**Luke 7:31-35**

<sup>31</sup> Jesus went on to say, "To what, then, can I compare the people of this generation? What are they like? <sup>32</sup> They are like children sitting in the marketplace and calling out to each other: "We played the pipe for you, and you did not dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not cry."

<sup>33</sup> For John the Baptist came neither eating bread nor drinking wine, and you say, 'He has a demon.' <sup>34</sup> The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and you say, 'Here is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners.' <sup>35</sup> But wisdom is proved right by all her children."

<sup>36</sup> When one of the Pharisees invited Jesus to have dinner with him, he went to the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. <sup>37</sup> A woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came there with an alabaster jar of perfume. <sup>38</sup> As she stood behind him at his feet weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfume on them.

<sup>39</sup> When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know who is touching him and what kind of woman she is—that she is a sinner."

<sup>40</sup> Jesus answered him, "Simon, I have something to tell you." "Tell me, teacher," he said. <sup>41</sup> "Two people owed money to a certain moneylender. One owed him five hundred denarii,<sup>[c]</sup> and the other fifty. <sup>42</sup> Neither of them had the money to pay him back, so he forgave the debts of both. Now which of them will love him more?" <sup>43</sup> Simon replied, "I suppose the one who had the bigger debt forgiven." "You have judged correctly," Jesus said.

<sup>44</sup> Then he turned toward the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I came into your house. You did not give me any water for my feet, but she wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. <sup>45</sup> You did not give me a kiss, but this woman, from the time I entered, has not stopped kissing my feet. <sup>46</sup> You did not put oil on my head, but she has poured perfume on my feet. <sup>47</sup> Therefore, I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven—as her great love has shown. But whoever has been forgiven little loves little."

<sup>48</sup> Then Jesus said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." <sup>49</sup> The other guests began to say among themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?"

<sup>50</sup> Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

### **Ephesians 4:17-24**

*"<sup>17</sup> So I tell you this, and insist on it in the Lord, that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their thinking. <sup>18</sup> They are darkened in their understanding and separated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them due to the hardening of their hearts. <sup>19</sup> Having lost all sensitivity, they have given themselves over to sensuality so as to indulge in every kind of impurity, and they are full of greed.*

*<sup>20</sup> That, however, is not the way of life you learned <sup>21</sup> when you heard about Christ and were taught in him in accordance with the truth that is in Jesus. <sup>22</sup> You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; <sup>23</sup> to be made new in the attitude of your minds; <sup>24</sup> and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.*

*<sup>25</sup> Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbour, for we are all members of one body."*
