Bridge Meeting

January 5, 2022

Commodore Annette Hawk called the meeting to order at 1:10. The meeting was entirely on Zoom due to the highly contagious Covid Omicron virus upon us at this time.

Due to the 40 minute time limit of a Zoom meeting, the agenda was revised to focus on dates for the social and cruise schedule, which need to be finalized for printing in the roster.

The first discussion focused on when to consider resumption of social events. Based on the current virus situation, a decision was made to hold off on any events in January, February, and March. April 10th will be the first social event listed on the calendar. In the event we are able to open the clubhouse in April, we will plan to make it a special occasion, more than a potluck. It will be 'Spring Fling', not to be confused with the type of Spring Fling we held offsite in the past.

Next on the agenda was the cruise schedule. Skip and Annette have each contacted various marinas for information. A potential cruise to Roche Harbor in April was nixed because Roche Harbor changes to prime season rates in mid-April. Rosario is currently not renting their beach facility for functions, making our only choice for gathering there being a catered dinner in the resort restaurant, at a cost of \$35-45 each.

Otter Bay Marina in Canada will not be taking yacht club reservations because they expect an influx of Canadian boaters who have not been able to visit there for two summers. Ladysmith and Ganges were also considered. The walk from the dock to town in Ladysmith is a steep incline, but once in town, Ladysmith has a nice grocery store for provisioning. There is also a café that is only open for lunch but has a space that can be rented for our group for an evening gathering. This cruise immediately follows the Stuart Island Cruise on Friday, June 3rd to Sunday, June 5th, so if we scheduled a cruise to Ganges on the 5th-7th, we couldn't take advantage of the popular Saturday Farmer's Market, and there is also the question of a place to gather in the evening.

Annette's research for a Friday Harbor cruise resulted in many options for activities, with the bonus that members without boats can easily get to Friday Harbor.
