Huong_Duong Thu <u>Paradise of the Blind</u>. Effects of the Vietnamese revolution on a particular family. Faqir_Fadia <u>Pillars of Salt</u>. Stories exchanged by two wives in a mental hospital whose experiences typify Jordanian experience during the British Mandate.

Thiong'o_Ngugi wa <u>The River Between</u>,. Colonial splits among Kenyans and the issue of female circumcision.

Idlibi_Ulfat_Sabriya: A Novel. Story of a Damascene woman's beleaguered life, from her country's revolt against the French in the 1920s in an oppressively patriarchal society.

Ghosh_Amitav Shadow Lines; Recent Indian political history especially partition and violence in Bengal. Ba Mariama So Long A Letter; Short story consisting of a widow's letter during her period of mourning after her husband's death, about her life and the double standards for men and women Hosseini_Khaled A Thousand Splendid Suns. Story of the lives of two women in living in Afghanistan during its turbulent years (war against the Soviets, warlord battles, Taliban rule and then life after the US invasion). *

Bridal_Tessa <u>Tree of Red Stars</u>. Tells the story of a young upper class woman and those close to her in Uruguay in the 1960's, as their democracy is gradually taken over by a military dictatorship.***

Azuela_Mariano <u>The Underdogs (Los de Abajo)</u>. Tells the story of the Mexican Revolution.

Al Qa'id_Yusuf_War in the Land of Egypt. Events in the 1973 war with Israel in Egypt from various angles.

Robbins David War of the Rats. Stalingrad snipers during WWII.

Thiong'o_Ngugi wa <u>Weep Not, Child</u>. World History AP Summer Reading Rubric

For this class you will need to read a total of four books and watch two movies.

Two book reviews and a movie review are due the day we return from Thanksgiving break, and the others at the start of the second semester. Books and movies will be assessed through book / movie reviews: each one is SHORT answers to the following 16 / 8 questions; you also have the option of doing a three paragraph argumentative essay for bonus. Each part is worth fifty points. You will be graded out of 150 and 150

I. Book Review Short answers two due by 12 / 2 /2013, two due by 1 / 7 / 2014

- 1. What is the thesis of the book? In other words, what is the author arguing or trying to prove? How do you know this?
- 2. Are there any examples of bias in the book? How do you know this?
- 3. With what particular time period(s) does the book deal?
- 4. In your opinion, is the topic/thesis covered thoroughly? Why?
- 5. Is the account given in broad outline or in detail? How do you know this?
- 6. For what group is the book intended (textbook, popular reading, scholarly)? Why?
- 7. What types of sources are used to support the book's thesis?
- 9. Is social, political, intellectual, cultural or economic history (SPICE) the emphasis of the book? Why?
- 10. Create a brief synopsis for four chapters. Explain what the focus of the chapter was, in regards to S.P.I.C.E.
- 11. Using the AP World History time period (8,000 BCE to present), describe a minimum of three world-changing events referred to in the text. (Remember S.P.I.C.E.)
- 12. Are dates used extensively and if so are they easy to follow? Can you tell what has transpired, are they helpful?
- 13. Are maps, charts, graphs or illustrations used? How are these to be evaluated? Are they helpful?
- 14. How does this book help you prepare for an A.P. World History course? Was it helpful?
- 15. What is your opinion of the book (please reflect before you answer)?
- 16. Discuss in detail two aspects you liked/enjoyed, and two aspects you did not like. Why?

All questions are worth two marks except question 10 which is worth 20

II. Film Review Short answers One due by 12 / 2 /2013, one due by 1 / 7 / 2014

- 1. What time period does the film take place in? What is the time span?
- 2. What civilization or part of the ancient world is the film portraying?
- 3. Who are the main characters in the film?
- 4. What, if any, known historical events were portrayed (year, place, people involved)?
- 5. When and where was the movie set? Describe the setting (forests, mountains, rivers, oceans, cities, etc).
- 6. Describe
 - a. The clothing (include hairstyles/shoes/accessories) of men, women, children of various classes and professions (politicians, soldiers/warriors)
 - b. The architecture (temples, homes, government buildings)
 - c. Any technological innovations (weapons, modes of transportation, tools)
- 7. What is your overall impression of the film? What did you like? What did you not like?
- 8. Try to summarize the plot in 8-10 sentences.

All questions are worth five marks except question 6 which is worth 15

Please Note: To make sure you get all the points make your work clear and easy to grade: you don't have to type it but, if your handwriting is not easy to read, you may wish to do so. Write the number of the question you are addressing next to your answer. Use full sentences, partial credit will not be given for confusing or incomplete work. Any good book review (both fiction and nonfiction) should be written as though the reader had not read the book in question. Hence, the reviewer must, as efficiently as possible, inform the readers about the general contents of the work:

- ✓ Subject matter, including its time period,
- ✓ general organization of the material,
- ✓ structure of the argument, and so on

III. Bonus Argumentative Essay this is a type of writing that requires you to investigate a topic; collect, generate, and evaluate evidence; and establish a position on the topic in a concise manner One can be handed in on 12 / 2 / 2013, another by 1 / 7 / 2014

Things to consider:

 What are some interesting/significant historical/cultural things you learned from this book / movie? Be specific! This should be the focus of your paper. You need to discuss the story line, but

only minimally. In some pieces the historical information is like part of the scenery, so do not tune it out but pay attention to it. Be sure to discuss the historical matter on which this is focusing as well as the additional historical information about that time period that appears in the background (things such as the themes mentioned above: technology, gender roles, etc.)

- What **historical questions were raised** for you about this topic? What in it inspired these questions? You need to come up with some questions. Having no questions is not an option.
- How did you like the book / movie overall? Would you recommend this for next year's summer reading list? Why or why not? Be specific. Saying you did not like the book will not negatively affect your grade.

Rubric (Introduction 10pts, 3 argumentative paragraphs 10pts each, conclusion 10 = 50pts)

Introduction

- grab the reader's attention with your first sentence interesting fact(s)
- background information the name of the book, the author, when and where it was published / the name of the movie, director, when and where it was released
- **thesis** state your scope, purpose, direction for this review what is your overall argument regarding this book and its historical benefit?

Body Paragraph 1 – FIRST area of focus

- topic sentence main idea or focus of the paragraph
- First part of your argument backed up with evidence from the book / movie, and if appropriate elsewhere.
- concluding sentence to make a transition to the next paragraph

Body Paragraph 2 – SECOND area of focus

- topic sentence main idea or focus of the paragraph
- Second part of your argument backed up with evidence from the book / movie, and if appropriate elsewhere.
- concluding sentence to make a transition to the next paragraph

Body Paragraph 3 – THIRD area of focus

- topic sentence main idea or focus of the paragraph
- Third part of your argument backed up with evidence from the book / movie, and if appropriate, elsewhere.
- concluding sentence to make a transition to the next paragraph

Conclusion

- summarize main points
- restate thesis in light of the arguments you have made above
- leave your reader with something to think about (did the book make the viewer more aware of history or just confuse the issue)
