New Cardinals and Musical Nuns

On the 28 November there will be 13 new Cardinals.

Nine of these will be under 80 years old and so can vote for a new Pope to succeed Pope Francis. Four of the thirteen will be over 80 and so cannot vote in a conclave. These four are made Cardinals as a sign of esteem and honour.

So by the beginning of December there will be 128 Cardinals under the age of 80 and eligible to vote in the conclave. Pope Francis will have named over half of them. Sixteen of the Cardinals named by Pope John Paul II will still be under 80 as will thirty nine of the Cardinals named by Pope Benedict XVI. Pope Francis will have named 73 of the electors.

Rwanda and Brunei are countries that will have a cardinal for the first time.

The musical nuns! For the Poor Clare community of Arundel, England, the idea that a record label might be interested in releasing an album of their music started out as a joke. "We heard that someone wanted to come along to Vespers to listen in. We thought he'd come along, hear us, and we'd never hear from him again."

But the producer loved what he heard. He'd been searching for a community of nuns to work with on an album of religious music. The sisters realised recording an album would allow them to bring the world to them - to invite people into their cloister.

The album - Light for the World - is released in the midst of a pandemic. The music helps people move from anxiety and stress to find the place of peace everyone needs.
