\$195.00). Our check for \$442.00 included \$192.00 for postage and \$250.00 for Mobility Worldwide (formerly called PET – Personal Energy Transportation). Our total value with kits and the check was \$2101.00. We are no longer required to include money for toothpaste for the hygiene kits.

The kits are distributed in response to requests within and beyond the United States. Thank you to everyone who contributed to the Mission Ingathering.

**The Share Shoppe:** Thank you to everyone who has volunteered to spend time working at the Share Shoppe during this year. The new sign-up sheet for 2020 will be on the table outside of the office. Our Church's assigned day to work is the second Thursday of each month from 1:00 - 4:00. We need two volunteers.

Here is a bit of information about the Share Shoppe from the shop's pamphlet:

The Share Shoppe was established in 1970 in Grafton. In 1991, it was relocated to Carpenter. Then in the summer of 2002, we moved to our current home in Northwood.

Our shop is a multi-church effort staffed by its volunteers providing clothing and household items/supplies to area residents. All merchandise is donated to the shop. Proceeds from donations and free will offerings are used to pay rent, utilities and cleaning.

Items accepted include: clothing, toys, household supplies, decorations, games, books, pictures/frames, dishes and other items in good condition, clean and ready for use.



Items we cannot accept include: car seats, cribs, helmets, microwaves and other similar items.

Gifts to Operation Clothes for Kids by Asbury counts as local mission giving.

#### LM SCHOOL SPECIAL NEEDS FUND

Some Asbury members have wished to contribute to the LM School Special Needs Fund. The Fund meets a variety of special needs by LM students, such as new clothes, lodging, doctor's visit, etc. This fund is operated by the Lake Mills School nurse, Joan Krull and managed by the Lake Mills Area Ministerial Association (LMAMA). 


