Christ the King, Max Stahl & Christopher Wenner

Max Stahl and Christopher Wenner are two names for the same person: early in his career (in children's TV, co-hosting Blue Peter for example) he was Christopher Wenner, and Max Stahl when he turned to film-making and journalism. In 1991 he was in East Timor. The former Portuguese colony was invaded by Indonesian forces in 1975: former East Timor President José Ramos-Horta called him a "treasured son". He became a national hero in East Timor after secretly filmed Indonesian soldiers open fire on students and young people protesting against Indonesian rule. He had been in East Timor to film a travel video, heard about the planned 12 November protest march after a memorial service for an independence supporter. As peaceful marchers reached Santa Cruz cemetery, soldiers opened fire killing hundreds of people. Mr Stahl crouched behind a gravestone filming the horrific scenes, and buried the film (film! 1991) in the graveyard, recovered it at night and later smuggled it out. The Santa Cruz footage was broadcast on television news across the world. His Catholic funeral was in Brisbane's St Stephen's on 12 November - exactly 30 years since his filming in East Timor. His burial is in that Santa Cruz cemetery - he maintained links with East Timor.

But. What's the link with Christ the King (last Sunday's feast)? "A kingdom of justice, love, and peace" is a phrase from the feast's liturgy.
