#### Only HIM (Health Information Management) can provide Medical Records

Only HIM staff are authorized to provide medical records. While Adult Protective Services and Child Protective Services have the authority to get medical records related to cases they are investigating, the records must come from Health Information Management (HIM), the department that is usually referred to as "Medical Records". VCSB does this for two reasons:

- 1. We have the legal requirement to keep track of the protected health information we disclose. Processing and distributing through HIM allows us to do that.
- 2. VCSB will only legally certify medical records for court if they are distributed by HIM.
