

WINDSOR HALL - SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 2021-2022

DEADLINE: August 31, 2021

INTRODUCTION

Windsor Hall, an IB MYP Candidate School, makes available scholarships to Canadian students for the enrollment in the IB MYP Programme offered by the same institute for the school years 2021-2022, and 2022-2023, starting from September, 2021.

1. PURPOSE OF THE SCHOLARSHIPS

The scholarships are made available to encourage talented students to start an educational path of excellence as the International Baccalaureate Middle Year Programme offered by Windsor Hall.

The scholarships made available by Windsor Hall are valid for two academic years, for the first and second year of the Middle Years Programme (i.e. grade 6 and grade 7). At Windsor Hall we are firmly convinced that facilitating the access of young people to educational paths of excellence contributes to laying the foundations of a society of responsible, competent and supportive citizens.

2. RECIPIENTS

Students who meet the requirements set out in article 4, can participate in the call for scholarship applications.

3. AMOUNT OF THE SCHOLARSHIPS

For the school year 2021-2022, Windsor Hall offers scholarships with total coverage of the Tuition Fee for the first academic year, and partial coverage of the Tuition Fee for the second academic year.

The following items remain at the candidate's expense: i) The Application Fee, ii) the Student Services Fees, the iii) Clubs & Academic Activities iv) Books Fees and v) all that is not included in the Tuition Fee.

Scholarship Amounts:

- Year 1 (2021-2022) Grade 6: 100% of the Tuition Fees
- Year 2 (2022-2023) Grade 7: 50% of the Tuition Fees

4. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Applications can only be submitted by students who meet the following requirements:

4.1 School GPA (Grade Point Average)

Students applying for scholarships must have reported in the last report card (i.e. the one relating to the current school year) an average grade not lower than:

- 5, relating to MYP 5 in the IB school system;
- B, relating to Year 5 in the Canadian school system;

4.2 Linguistic requirements

Candidates must have a level of knowledge of written and spoken English equal to at least a B2 level of the European Framework of Languages.

4.2 Admissions Assessment

Candidates are required to take Windsor Hall's Admissions Assessment, to demonstrate their level of Numeracy and Literacy.

5. SELECTION AND AWARDING PROCEDURE FOR SCHOLARSHIPS 5.1 Jury

The evaluation of the applications will be carried out by a jury made up of members of the Windsor Hall Board and Admissions department (hereinafter called the Jury).

5.2 Awarding criteria

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of a ranking that will take into account the following criteria of merit:

From 0 to 50 points:

- a. School results of the last 2 years;
- b. English and Math test (to be taken at Windsor Hall),

From 50 to 100 points:

- a. Individual interview, in which the student's personal and academic profile (personal and academic goals) and personal motivation will be assessed. The interview will take place in English:
- b. Academic personal successes (awards, publications, etc.) and non-academic personal successes (participation in voluntary initiatives and social commitment);
- c. Letter of self-introduction of the candidate, including the description of his/her academic and personal profile and the reasons in support of the application. The evaluation will take place at the absolute discretion of the Jury.

5.4 Communication to winners and acceptance of the scholarship

The winners will be notified **via e-mail** by Windsor Hall Admissions Staff to the e-mail address provided at the moment of the application, **within one week of receiving the application**.

The winners must send a **formal acceptance** by e-mail to the address from which they will receive the communication, **within 3 (three) working days from the notice**. If the winner does not follow this procedure, the scholarship will be considered rejected by the winner and, therefore, it will be automatically assigned to the next candidate in the ranking.

From the moment of acceptance, **the winner will have 5 (five) days to submit the application for admission** and pay the registration fee, following the relative registration procedure.

6. OBLIGATIONS OF SCHOLARSHIP HOLDERS AND MAINTENANCE OF THE SCHOLARSHIP6.1 Obligations of scholarship holders

The scholarships made available by Windsor Hall have a two-year duration. To maintain the scholarship during the entire period indicated, the winner must comply with

the following obligations:

- maintain good academic results;
- contribute as an active and positive member of the school community;
- demonstrate constant frequency and punctuality.

6.2 Withdrawal of the scholarship

Through a justified measure the members of Windsor Hall Board reserve the right to withdraw a scholarship that was awarded, if the student's marks, attitude, behavior, frequency and punctuality are considered unsatisfactory.

7. SUBMISSION OF THE APPLICATION

7.1 Procedure for submitting the applications

Applications for the selection related to the awarding of scholarships must be sent only via email at admissions@windsorhall.ca

7.2 Deadline for applications

All applications must be submitted by August 31st, 2021 at 10:00 am (PST).

7.3 Documents required

The parents/guardians of the candidate must fill out the application form on the website https://canadastarsecondary.openapply.com/apply/forms/38554 and attach the following documents:

- Student's photo ID
- The latest 2 report cards;
- Letter of self-introduction of the candidate:
- Letter of academic recommendation from one of the candidate's teachers;
- Letter of recommendation from a member of a sports or voluntary association or another organization (optional).

7.4 Exclusions and responsibilities

All applications received after the deadline referred to in article 7.2 of the Call for scholarship applications will be automatically rejected.
