#### **Programs and Workshops**

**October 16, 2019** Guild Meeting and Workshop – Speaker – Lori Lee Tripplett

Lori is the Business Manager for Ouilt and Textile Collections and has successfully combined a variety of passions which include research, writing, and performing into the quilt world. As a lecturer and instructor she brings her experience from stage, screen, and radio to make the presentations fun yet educational. As an award winning writer Lori has written more than 15 books as well as numerous magazine or journal articles with more on the way. Her most recent book co-written with her sister Kay Triplett, is Hidden Treasures from the Poos Collection. Lori's lecture and Trunk Show on October 16, Exploring the Poos Collection will explore the origins of the Poos Collection, one of the largest privately held quilt collections in the world. This trunk show presents a variety of different antique and contemporary quilts as well as textiles from around the world. Lori's lecture will include a discussion about how the collection faired through Hurricane Harvey.

Sadly, The planned workshop for the day following has been canceled due to lack of sign ups as well as no location has been found for the workshop.

# November 20, 2019 Guild Meeting Program

Our speaker for November is Dot Collins from Port Neches, Texas. She tries everything new that comes out, so is not "known" for any one style, though one thing that is quickly recognized might be her use of plains and stripes in her guilts. One of her quilts that was made using all plaids won an honorable mention ribbon at the Paducah Ouilt Show and a Judges Choice ribbon at the Houston Quilt Festival in 1994. It was featured on the cover of the October 1995 Quilters Newsletter Magazine and it was the November page in the 1996 Lang Quilt calendar and in several other quilt magazines.

Dot's program and trunk show is titled "Revisiting Color Theory".



Starting with monochromatic (one color quilts) and working through many combinations of colors on the

color wheel, the quilts exhibited will demonstrate why you can use published theories to choose colors and fabrics for your quilts. There will be around 25 - 30 quilts shown and a quilted color wheel will also be available to follow the color theory

I will have fabric examples at the next few meetings. Blocks can be turned into me anytime up to the November meeting. We will present all blocks at our Christmas party. 
