### Petit Jean Mountain Rendezvous Camp Rules and Information

November 21-25, 2018

#### **Petit Jean State Park**

Campers may set up anytime between 8:00 am Wednesday, November 21 and 9:00 a.m. Friday, November 24, 2018. No early arrivals permitted on the rendezvous field. If you arrive earlier, you must use standard park campgrounds – reservations / fees applicable. During set up days, vehicles must leave the field by 5:00 pm.

Campers must have period early 1800's style camp and outfit at Rendezvous site.

Fire pits are allowed. Save the sod and replace after use. You must empty pit and replace sod at the end of the event. Keep an eye on your fire, and only burn while you are at your camp. A water bucket should be in your camp.

No alcohol is allowed during public event hours (9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday and 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Sunday). Excessive alcohol will NOT be tolerated.

Absolutely no alcohol will be allowed during black powder demonstrations. Violators will be expelled from the park.

Rendezvous campers must not sell or give away food/drink to event visitors.

Black powder demonstrators will **NOT LOAD ANY PROJECTILE** in firearms. There is not an established range at the Rendezvous site. Demonstrators will load powder and wadding only. Direction of fire for aerial discharge of guns will be away from the camp. Please double-check your ramrod.

Before any discharge of firearms, "Fire in the Hole!!!" will be called.

Quiet hours for the park start at 10:00 p.m. Non-amplified music (including tall-tales) can go on until midnight. Just be courteous.

Pets must be leashed at all times. Please remove any waste which should occur from the animal. (Rendezvous folks walk around with and without moccasins at times.)

All vehicles must be removed from site and placed in the parking area at the pool. This will be your parking area. Approved devices for persons with disabilities can be used at anytime and anywhere.

Portable toilet facilities are located extremely close to the Rendezvous site. If needing more civilized facilities or hot showers, use bathhouses at either camping area A or B.

Water is provided at the south end of the camp. The woodpile will be close by.

Campers are **highly encouraged to participate in scheduled demonstrations**. The camp will be open to the public from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday and 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Sunday. The park sees a large amount of visitors during this weekend, and they want to see you do your stuff.

During the event contact Supt. Joe Buckley, Park Interpreters BT Jones/Matt Manos or uniformed staff for assistance or problems.

That's why we are here. Call Mather Lodge at 501-727-5431 24-hours a day if you have an emergency or need help.

Don't forget the Pilgrims! We were all pilgrims once trying to find out how to do this stuff. Help 'em out and answer their questions. Remember that buckskinner who took the time to answer our questions way back when. Be a model for others.

#### **Note From Petit Jean Park Staff**

Greetings to Rendezvous camps.

We are looking forward to yet another great Rendezvous at Petit Jean State Park this year. Please help us to get out the following information:

A note on Arkansas State law on state sales tax:


Those Rendezvous vendors who already have an Arkansas State Sales Tax Permit in place need do nothing differently. They can report on their own, but those reporting on their own have to be noted as doing so by park officials to the Department of Finance and Revenue.

Those vendors who do not have an Arkansas State Sales Tax Permit will be given a form for tracking daily sales. The sales tax will be collected by the park, and the form and tax will be sent to the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration. The sales tax percentage is currently 8.75%.

All Petit Jean Mountain Rendezvous participants selling merchandise are required to comply with state law. The DFA forms for reporting will be handed out upon arrival at registration.
