





The Easter Fire was kindled after Morning Prayer, and has continued to burn patiently until this solemn moment. All of the lights in the church are off, and the community turns to view the blessing of the new fire.

The Priest lights the paschal candle from the new fire, saying:

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

MOTHER OF ALL FEASTS
