And THEN, within the span of a week or so, we lost TWO prominent, seminal figures in the life of St. Paul: former staff member Lollie Kasulones, and perennial staff member Evelyn Osterbrock. Talk about a one-two punch to the gut!

Both of these women, loved and respected by so many over the years, had been ill for a while. Evelyn had been a hospice patient since *last* year at this time—and she surprised us all by bouncing back from being bedridden and unable to walk, and worked <u>another whole season</u>—at age 95—in her capacity as lay minister to children. Lollie fought a long, hard battle with cancer—and she handled that the same when she took on life and ministry when she served here at SPUCC: with courage determination, faith, and optimism. Both of these faithful servants had a <u>huge</u> impact on the life of St. Paul, and <u>in</u> the lives of so many members here; they cannot be and never will be forgotten. We bless and give thanks for them, and continue to pray for their loved ones.

It's just a coincidence, I think, that we are faced with this strange conjunction of loss and bad news during the season of Lent...especially so in this. Lenten season, when I am trying to help us experience the sacred time of return in a less somber, less-penitential, and more "grounded" and spiritually-affirming way. We're getting "back to basics"—specifically, the basic elements of creation and life on Earth. We're using Creation as a lens for seeing the Holy, and our dependence upon God---and each other. Deeper than that, even: we're looking at Creation, including our own place in it, as a "container" of God, as exemplars of the Sacred...as INCARNATIONS. What do elements and essences, seasons and cycles, birth and death, joy and suffering teach us? What do these things show us about God? About how we should live?

Ponderings From The Pastor (continued)

We're aiming at a more holistic, richer understanding of Lent...Holy Week...of "Cross and Crown"...of suffering and sacrifice...of death, and resurrection.

We need to get below the surface...to go deep. It is below ground, in the deep, where we don't see it, that life begins. In the dirt and ashes. In the muck of life. Think about it...

When we are trying to get established in life, or in a new place, we speak of "putting down roots." Hard work. And, we remember the early church was born "underground" and matured in the <u>catacombs</u>—the underground burial chambers—avoiding the persecutions of the ancient Roman empire. In the disease-ridden, violent Middle Ages, huge cathedrals and entire towns even, were built around the relics of saints—buried in <u>vaults</u> underground in the transepts of churches. Slaves were swept to freedom through the Underground Railroad. Inhumane, unjust, evil systems were toppled with the help of the "Underground." Major social initiatives, like the Civil Rights movement, started as <u>grassroots</u> crusades. Below the surface.

Meaningful change—transformation—is not a common, surface activity, it seems.

Jesus understood. "I assure you that unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it can only be a single seed. But if it dies, it bears much fruit" [John 12.24]. The Passion of the Christ is about seed planting...about what happens underground, in a grave...in the pitch black, amidst grief and tears...when no one is looking. When loss and pain, fear and anger, have taken hold on the surface.

So then...even if you're <u>reeling</u> from loss, hurt, disappointment, confusion...even if you are seeing goblins on the plane wing like Bob Wilson did (William Shatner, in the \underline{TZ} episode "Nightmare at 20,000 Feet"), or feel trapped in the "Upside Down" like Chief Hopper ("Stranger Things" S2, E5), <u>do not lose heart</u>. When the problems and pain of the present seem ready to overwhelm, remember: these things are <u>only temporary</u>. Or when we think about the future and become anxious and unsure, remember: what <u>cannot</u> be seen is <u>eternal</u>—GOD'S future is <u>even today</u> beginning to reach back into our Now and pull us forward...even if we <u>do</u> not yet see it.

As we continue our walk through Lent, toward Holy Week, let <u>each day</u> be a holy day; stop and remember that your INNER NATURE—your True Self—is constantly being renewed, even as your body and physical self (your "surface self") grows older. **Do not lose heart**. God's plan for you and me is <u>beyond all measure</u>; think about that...<u>beyond</u> our conception...beyond our seeing and full knowing. And that doesn't mean "when you get to heaven" either—that means here today, <u>NOW</u>, the very moment we learn to "let God and let God," trust God, <u>live and trust in the moment</u>.

Let's learn more of the practices of mindfulness, humility, and gratitude. Let's practice "seed planting" and know that loss is an <u>integral</u> part of spiritual growth. In the moment, mindful living and gratitude may not make the pain hurt less...but it'll put a smile on your face, lift you heart, cause a little uprising of joy from your renewing inner nature, and strengthen you <u>despite</u> the pain. Then you will see the world as Christ saw it—as God sees it.

You'll be participating in Resurrection.

Lord, You have made so many things!
How wisely You made them all!
The earth is filled with your creatures....
All of them depend on You. — Psalm 104:24-27 (a good theme Psalm for Lent).

Press on—and remember: YOU are stardust!

ST. PAUL UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST Council Meeting January 22, 2018

Present:

Jan Apro, Rev. Barry Bordendircher, Linda Woods, Anne Zimmer, Margaret Maybury, Lois Manifold, Vicky Ritz, Nancy Klusmeier, Marge Fassnacht, Joan Allen

Vice President, Jan Apro, called the meeting to order at 7:05 P.M. Linda Woods offered an opening prayer. The minutes of the November 20, 2017, meeting were reviewed by Council. A **MOTION** was made (Maybury/Manifold) to approve said minutes. **MOTION PASSED** and the minutes were approved as printed.

Finance Team (Margaret Maybury)

- Margaret distributed copies of her proposed Budget for 2018 and reviewed it, item by item, with Council, comparing numbers to 2017's Budget and Actual.
- Discussion regarding things that came in over and under budget for 2017.
- The Congregational Meeting is now set for February 25th. We have to have the proposed Budget approved by Council for taking to the Congregation two (2) weeks prior to the meeting, as per our By-laws.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> (Anne Zimmer)

- All bills are paid and current. Out of the money taken out of the Christian Vocation Fund, she has only used \$3,000.
- Anne reviewed the Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual and Balance Sheet with Council.
- She received an advance rent check from the Nursery School for \$10,000.
- As always, copies of financial reports are available in the office for anyone who wishes to see them.

Endowment Report (Jan Apro)

- Jan reports that he is working on a final Endowment Report and will be done in the next week or so and will get that to Council.
- We are doing very well. The interest we received on the accounts for 2017 was over \$18,000.
- Pastor Barry asked about the Christian Vocation Fund and if it would be used for training, but only after going through proper channels.

Care Team (Marge Fassnacht)

- The Zone still hasn't hired anyone.
- She hasn't had a meeting in January since Roxanne went to Florida.
- Discussion regarding Pastor Barry's meeting with the Alliance and The Zone. He wants to be more connected with them.

Facilities Team (Jan Apro for Rick Davis)

- The parking lot lights are now on timers thanks to Mark Heitman. One of the lights still needs work and Mark and Paul Kluesener are going to work on it.
- The snow removal contract has been signed and sent back. During the week, only the north parking lot
 was going to be plowed for the Nursery School. However, Rick said he would do both lots if it snows.
 Jimmy has Ryan's number and will call if additional is needed.
- Anne said the claim for the north side of the sanctuary roof has been paid less the deductible of \$2,500. We received a check for over \$50,000 and work will be done in May or June.

Nurture Team (Linda Woods)

- Linda reports that her Team met tonight.
- Nursery School is having a general Open House on Thursday and a Pre-K Information Session Tuesday night.
- The Nursery School Carnival is March 3. They have a Dine & Donate at Krimmer's Italianette next weekend.
- Paul installed a lock on door for lockdown and went over procedures.
- Pastor Barry shared information for new way of doing Christian Formation Wednesday night Sunday School for youth.

Welcome Team (Lois Manifold)

- Marlene Sheward has been a real asset. She is taking over Ellie Reed's job of sending cards out.
- Lois reported that Ruth Meisner was taken to the hospital this morning and she doesn't know if she was kept or sent back.

Worship Team (Vicky Ritz)

- Next events for Worship Team is Ash Wednesday on February 14. Then there is Maundy Thursday Service.
- Easter is April 1. Judith will take flower orders for Easter. We now have wine for communion along with grape juice. Inner circle will be grape juice and all else is wine.

Lay Minister's Report (Joan Allen)

- Joan submitted to Council a report of her time spent from October to January including October lock-in, bake sale, training for acolytes, Tuesday dinners, staff meetings, Sunday school, Christmas play and practices, MARCC meeting (preparation and clean-up), funeral, Cluster meeting, Safety Training.
- Kids have a lock-in on February 9 and 10. They will plan spring and summer activities. SPY flower sale is on the 11th.
- Acolytes trying to get more kids trained.

- Choirfest has been moved to April 22nd. Pulpit exchange will also be that day.
- She turned in a bill for her mileage and got a check.

Sr. Minister's Report (Rev. Barry Bordenkircher)

- The Sanctuary has to be at 76 degrees for the piano and organ so we might as well have services there on Sunday when it's cold.
- The pastor will make the call on Sundays to cancel church if there is bad weather. It will be on channels 5, 9 and 12.
- Discussed "One Call Now" service since some people don't have e-mail. It sets up group calls to people regarding events or cancellations, etc. Annual contract is \$450.
- Pastor Barry distributed a report of his time spent and mileage for November-December including hospital and pastoral visits, funeral prep and funerals, MARCC and SONKA. Total 222 miles.
- Pastor Barry distributed his notes to Council from a workshop on church safety at First UCC in College
 Hill. Council went over it. We need to have a policy. Discussion regarding different aspects. Thank you
 to Jan who has done a lot with this.
- Good Samaritan Fund Discussion regarding protocol for use of the funds.
- He is taking a prayer retreat next week.

NEW BUSINESS

- Anne is taking vacation to Florida from January 30th to February 7th. Skip got approval from doctor. He starts immune therapy when they get back.
- Don Beresford is doing well. Great news!
- In general, Pastor Barry would like people to come to him directly with any issues or problems.

A **MOTION** was made (Maybury/Ritz) to adjourn. **MOTION PASSED** and the meeting adjourned at 8:40 P.M. with The Lord's Prayer.
