<u>Club Meetings</u>: General Meetings are held at the Boambee Hall at 7.00 pm on the first Thursday of each month except for January when no meeting is normally held.

<u>Club Fees:</u> A joining fee of \$5.00 applies. Annual fees are \$45.00 for a Single Membership, \$50.00 for a Family Membership, \$15.00 for a Junior Membership and \$10.00 for Associate Membership. Fees are due on 1^{st} January each year for the calendar year. However, as membership of an approved car club is an RMS requirement for Concessional Registration of vehicles, annual fees for members seeking registration of cars in the following year are payable at the Rego Day, normally the third Sunday in November. For members joining the Club after 30 June each year, half annual fees will apply.

<u>Club Newsletter:</u> A full-colour copy of the Club's newsletter "Coffs Splutter" is emailed to all members with a valid email address registered with the Club. For an annual fee of \$15.00 (payable to the Treasurer) a member may arrange to have a printed B/W copy delivered by Australia Post to an address of their choice.

The Lansley's Story

Our story with vintage cars starts in Sydney in 1971 when we purchased a 1928 Buick Sedan. Sounds good but we manhandled most of the parts into the shed by wheelbarrow! Sold the Buick in beginning of 1972 and purchased a Chrysler Tourer later in the year.

We moved to Coffs Harbour in 1973 for John to take a position as Sales Rep for Castrol (John's nick name was Sol...after the Castrol advertisement).

The Chrysler was too heavy for the company car to trailer to Coffs Harbour so we left itwith- a friend in Gosford. We eventually sold it in Sydney to be restored.

The Coffs Harbour Veteran and Vintage Car Club was started in 1974. We joined the club in 1975 just missing being foundation members. In 1976 we purchased an Austin Wasp from Club Member Alan Biggs. John worked for many hours — many days. After many months he finished it by the end of the year (it had a nick name — "Jaffa"). Because it was on old English car, John gained another nick name — "Noddy".

At the Taree Rally that year, the Austin Wasp won first prize for best 1930 to 1940's car. 1977 and it is now Coffs' turn to have a rally and Lorraine was Rally Secretary with Geoff Maunder as Treasurer and John Budd as President, and John and other members on the committee. John bought a Whippet from club member John Moore.

1980 Lorrraine was secretary of the club and John started work on the Whippet, which he sold later in the year. Newcastle was to hold the Bush Council Rally and we are on our way, but at Donnellyville, we were engaged in an accident in the Austin Wasp. We has to send it home on a trailer. We travelled on to Newcastle with club members.

1988 we purchased our first Model A tourer from Alan Biggs (ex Gerry Kent) both club members. Later in the year we used the car for Jeff and Jo's wedding. In 1990 we sold the A Model tourer. An A Model Tudor 2 door arrives from Sydney in a furniture van. John had to get into the car and start it so we could get it out of the van. In 1992 The Model A Ford Club held a National Rally in Western Australia. We went with the Ford Model A Club Qld Branch. We travelled by train called the "A Train" to WA and then drove back via the Nullarbor and Broken Hill. We sold the Model A to a member of the Brisbane Model A club in 1994.

1997 saw John as Club President. We purchased another Ford, this time a 1934 Ford V8.

The Club needed a stand-in Secretary in 1998 and Lorraine said yes. In 2000 John was made a Life member of the club. Guess what...another Ford Model A, this time a 1928 ute bought from Bruce in Port Macquarie. 2001 was a big year as the Ute had its first club run. We went to NZ with the Model A Club of Australia with Bleasdale's from Port Macquarie. Then, sad to say, we sold the Austin Wasp to Warren Phemister.

In 2003 Lorraine and Bob Dixon took on the club magazine. About this time, John took on organising the raffles. About this time, we became good friends with the Poulters from the Armidale Club. They asked us to go a Presidents run with them in 2007 and 11 runs later until 2019 when Covid put a stop to this event. The next car to be sent on its way was the V8 Ford. The club held the Hub Rally in 2010 with Alison as Secretary and Lorraine as Assistant.

The next car into the family shed was the Triumph TR4. Graeme Kane asked John to come with him to Bribane to look at his new prospective TR4....Guess who came home with a TR4??

We had a lot of fun in the TR4, but by 2014, it was time for a change so goodbye to the TR4 and hello to the 1969 Torana which we found in South Australia. Lismore held a rally in 2015 and we went with the Torana. Oooppps...a B-double ran into us. Not his fault as we were on the side of the road and a car came out in front of him. He did not see us as his truck was so big.

Lorraine receieved an award at the Christmas party in 2017 and then was awarded "Member of the Year in 2018". During this time Lorraine and John have been on most committees. John was awarded "Stirrer of the Year" many times.

We have enjoyed the fellowship of members and their families and also other clubs over many happy years.



Postscript to the Minutes from President Geoff Maunder

When I read the minutes of the December meeting, I felt that the interpretation of the vote count was incorrect. I reread the Department of Fair Trading guidelines on special resolutions, which confirmed my understanding of the rules: https://www.fairtrading.nsw.gov.au/associations-and-co-operatives/associations/running-an-association/resolutions

The Dept of Fair Trading wording outlines that a special resolution will be passed if:

- the conditions imposed by Fair Trading, if any, are met,
- a quorum* of members required by the constitution is present, if the special resolution is put to members at a meeting, and
- it is supported by at least three-quarters of the *valid votes cast* in person or by proxy, if proxy votes are allowed by the constitution (our constitution does not allow for postal or proxy votes).

The conditions above were met at the December Meeting;

- 1. 21 days notice was given to members,
- 2. a quorum of members was present 25% of voting members, and
- 3. the Special Resolution was supported by at least three-quarters of the valid votes cast in person.

I required clarification of the term valid votes as the count was 21 for, 6 against and 4 abstentions.

In total 27 people voted, 21 for and 6 against giving a result of 77.77% voting for the motion.

I phoned Dept of Fair Trading to clarify the abstentions and my enquiry was passed on by Sonia to a "Subject Matter Expert" whose response was that abstentions are not considered and the total number of valid votes is 27 meaning the motion was passed.

The minutes will be amended at the next opportunity which will be the February meeting.

I realise this may not sit well with some members and others may be delighted.

The vote was taken, eligible members cast their vote and the motion was passed in the affirmative.

It is now time to move on and, as someone who shall remain nameless said, something like "Lets make CHVV&C Car Club GREAT again".

We are, and always, have been a social club with members helping each other out with mechanical and technical assistance as well as checking on wellbeing and state of mind thanks to Covid so let us put this issue to bed and get back to what we have done so well since July 1974 when the club was formed.

National Motor Museum Birdwood (South Australia)

On a recent trip to visit our son and his family we had the pleasure to visit the Birdwood Motor Museum. The museum originally started in 1964 as the Birdwood Mill Pioneer, Art and Motor Museum. It was located partly in The Old Birdwood Mill, which today still has a small display. The museum was bought by the South Australian government in 1976. It is the largest motor museum in Australia.



The museum spans over several galleries.

There are over 400 motor vehicles on display, including some that are historically significant. A small number of the vehicles are in pristine condition, while others are well-used, or waiting for restoration. There are a variety of permanent exhibitions and changing exhibitions that bring new displays and ideas into the museum.


