November Lunch and Program

It's time to sign up for the Nov. 10 luncheon. The deadline is 4:00 PM Friday. Nov. 4. That's coming right up so get on in to ASI. The menu is...what did you expect? And what do you like? It's roast turkey of course, with the usual trimmings—smashed potatoes, peas and carrots, dinner rolls and—what did you expect? Pumpkin pie.

If you read the newsletter you already know something about the program. Here's more. Ann Mills Griffin, who has led the National League of POW/MIA Families since August 1978, first as Executive Director and, since August 2011, as Chairman of the Board, with CEO responsibilities, will be ASI's speaker.

She now focuses primarily on US policy, operations, and sustaining the League's financial health. She serves as an Adviser to the US side of the US-Russia Joint Commission (USRJC) on POW/MIAs and, at the request of the Secretary of Defense, she served as a Commissioner on the Department of Defense 50* Anniversary Vietnam War Commemoration.

Since 1970, the League has fought for the return of POWs, the fullest possible accounting for those listed as MIA, and the recovery and identification of remains of those who died serving our nation. She was instrumental in setting up high level negotiations between Vietnam and the US in 1982-83. She continues to represent POW/MIA families and our missing personnel in direct contacts with US and foreign leaders.

Ms. Mills-Griffiths has led or participated in numerous delegations to Southeast Asia, meeting with senior officials. As a recognized leader on POW/MIA issues and recipient of many honors, she has appeared frequently before congressional committees and the media, and provides advice and counsel to other nations facing personnel accounting issues.

She has participated for decades in policy dealing with Southeast Asia and, more recently has encouraged pursuing answers on a separate humanitarian basis, despite policy and political differences, with the PRC, DPRK and the Russian Federation

Her commitment results from her brother Lt. JG James B. Mills' disappearance on a night low-flying mission over North Vietnam Sept. 21,

1966. Despite uncertainty about the incident, and thanks to near-miraculous site discovery and dedication by DPAA's underwater archeologists, Mills' remains were recovered and identified in Aug. 2018. He was buried June 24, 2019, in Arlington National Cemetery.

Additional Special Program

Ann Mills Griffin (after speaking at 10 AM at the Vietnam Memorial Monument in Salinas and appearing at the 2:00 PM Veterans Day parade) will again be speaking at ASI from 6:00 PM to about 8:00 PM on Friday, Nov. 11 (Veterans Day).

If you are particularly interested in the POW/MIA program, this will be a great opportunity for extended Q and A sessions. We are contacting Veteran's organizations inviting their members to attend. The event is free, but we will ask for donations for the National League of POW/MIA Families.




