Holcombe UMC Mission Committee – November 2020

Our committee met at 1:00pm on Tuesday, November 17, 2020, with 3 members present: Pastor Paul, Liz Dempsey & Cheri Bingham.

Pastor Paul started the meeting with prayer.

Reviewed the September 2020 meeting minutes, as well as the October update written for the Parish Post.

Old business:

Odanah church was sent check for 2019 & 2020 Native American Sunday offerings. Liz will check to be sure they have received this.

Received a 'Thank-You' from the Chippewa Family Support Center for the donation of 4 boxes of warm socks that the congregation donated.

Update on ongoing projects:

Care-Net baby bottle collection is still in progress. Several bottles are still out and the opportunity to give to this will continue through December. Please try to return all bottles by the end of the year. Special Sunday offerings- decision to hold on these for November & December.

Noisy Bucket offerings- Since we are not meeting in-person for worship we have not been collecting these offerings. The group felt that this was a very much needed project. The 'Noisy Bucket' and information about what it goes toward will be moved to the entryway. Folks can bring in their offering of coins when the church is open & the counters will deposit when they process the general offerings. Missionary Covenant Relationship Agreement- This was included in the 2021 budget for the HUMC. The group decided to continue with a one-year agreement (rather than a 3 year or indefinite period). Cheryl was directed to complete the form for Carla & the General Board of Global Ministries. (Note-this fund goes to help support a missionary working at Mujila Falls in Zambia, Africa.)

The Holcombe Food Pantry was being moved to their new facility on the day of our meeting. We decided to hold on a church sponsored food collection until 2021. Those wishing to donate food or funds should do so directly to the food pantry.

School Fund Drive- Thank you to all that supported this project to benefit urgent student needs at our Lake Holcombe school, as well as our college students. The group worked on a list of college students & will send them a note of encouragement from the HUMC along with a small gift in early December. Cheryl will contact Carla about the allocation of the funds collected for the project.

New Business:

The Holcombe UMC will sponsor one family from Holcombe for Christmas. Liz has been working with the school regarding this project and she will be coordinating efforts for our Mission's group. There are 3 children: two boys ages 9 and 13, and one girl age 17. All gifts will need to be at the church no later than 12/9/2020. More information regarding this, as well as suggested gifts, will be posted when available. Meeting closed with prayer.

Our next HUMC Mission meeting will be at 1:00 on Tuesday, 12/8/2020.
