Preschool: This weather has been all over the place! I know we are only here for 3 hours a day; however, we do still try to go outside unless it is raining. Please make sure your child is dressed appropriately. These mornings have been very cool! Students won't be allowed to go outside unless they are dressed for it. This week we will continue to talk about Thanksgiving. We have learned about pilgrims and who they invited to the first Thanksgiving. Thank you to all who helped with the delayed Halloween party. Kind: Happy Monday! This week and next week our focus will be on Thanksgiving and scarecrows. During phonics instruction, we will be introducing /j/ and /oa/. In Math, we are beginning the stages of talking about money/coins, telling time to the hour, and ordinal position to the fourth. These are all things that you can discuss with your child at home to help them get some extra practice. Grades will go home on Friday. If you have any questions, please reach out!

1st/2nd: First and second grade did well on their spelling review last week. Thirty words are a lot! This week we will have a new list and the spelling test will be on Friday. First grade has a very short science unit this time, so they will have another science test on Friday. Second grade will finish their science unit with a test on Friday as well. Study guides will go home Wednesday. Mid-quarter was Friday and several students are behind on their AR tests. Please encourage your child to read at home, so they will be ready to take their AR tests when they get to school. - **Mrs. Hird**

3rd/4th: We finally have everyone back out of quarantine and our class is whole again! Our class will continue to push on, so we can end on a good note before Thanksgiving break. Both third and fourth grades will have math tests this week. Spelling this week is a review week. That means third grade will have 35 words and fourth grade will have 50 words. The students have seen all of these words before. If you have any questions about anything we have going on this week, please don't hesitate to reach out to me. - **Mrs. Cooper**

5th/6th: In Writing, 5th graders will be writing haikus and 6th graders will be working on quatrain poetry. In Science, 5th grade will test over Ch. 2 on Friday and 6th grade will test over Ch. 2 next Tuesday. In Reading, students will look at chapters 13-14 of our Lit. Circle book and will present roles on Friday. In Social Studies, 5th graders will test over Ch. 1 L. 3 & 4 next Tuesday and 6th grade Native American dioramas and posters are due on Friday. 5th grade will have a states and capitals test on Friday over #1-40. **7/8 Comm. Arts:** Students will be reading Ch. 16-17 of their Lit. Circle book and will present roles on Friday. 5th-8th grade AR requirements are due Friday, December 10th. Keep reading! - **Mrs. Foster**

7/8: In social studies, seventh grade is continuing to learn about the time of the Roman Empire. In eighth grade, students are in the middle of chapters on the American Revolution. In math, seventh grade is working with scientific notation,

looking at simplified forms of mixed measures, and working with basic functions. In pre-algebra, students are looking at part/whole problems, particularly with mixed numbers, various types of rate problems, and complex fractions. In algebra, students are working with the lowest common multiple of algebraic terms, the graphing of conjunctions, and more difficult part/whole problems. Look for mid-quarters to come home this week. **Tests This Week: 7/8 Science: Tuesday, 7/8 Social Studies: Wednesday, Algebra: Wednesday, Pre-Algebra: Friday, 7/8 Math Vocabulary Test: Tuesday 5/6 Math:** In fifth grade, students are demonstrating their measurement skills, looking at part/whole relationships, and recognizing simplified forms of mixed measures. In sixth grade, students are continuing to perform operations with fraction/decimal percent equivalencies, looking at prime factorizations to create reduced fractions, and taking an early look at probability. **Tests This Week: 5th Math: Wednesday, 6th Math: Friday, 5/6 Math Vocabulary Test: Tuesday - Mr. Ewing**
