UN Climate Change Conference For the first time, the leaders of the Roman Catholic Church, the Eastern Orthodox Church and the Anglican Communion have jointly warned of the urgency of environmental sustainability, its impact on poverty, and the importance of global co-operation. In a joint statement, the Christian leaders have called on people to pray for world leaders ahead of the UN Climate Change Conference COP26 in November in Glasgow, which is the most important meeting of its kind since the Paris Agreement was adopted in 2015. Pope Francis, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew and Archbishop Justin Welby urge everyone to play their part in safeguarding the future of the planet: "We must decide what kind of world we want to leave to future generations. We must choose to live differently; we must choose life." The three Christian leaders spoke against inequality and highlighted the "profound injustice" that it is the world's poorest who are suffering the worst impacts of our disregard for the environment. In their joint declaration, they conclude that: "This is a critical moment. Our children's future and the future of our common home depend on it."

WE SHALL CONTINUE TO REQUIRE PEOPLE TO WEAR MASKS UNLESS MEDICALLY EXEMPT

- 1. <u>Freeing the Benches</u> Ribbons have been taken off the <u>left hand</u> side of the church as this is the side where we do not have to socially distance, <u>but kneelers are NOT to be used</u>. The <u>right hand</u> side of the church will remain socially distanced and taped off, for those who feel the need to shield a bit more.
- 2. 'Leave a Space Cards' are available to pick up from the porch table and at the back of the church so that people who wish to maintain a space between themselves and the next person can put a card beside them on the bench.
- 3. <u>Track and Trace</u> We shall follow our track and trace routines for as long as the NHS system is in operation. We shall keep the track and trace mass sheets, as well as the QR system. **This is mandatory**.
- 4. <u>One Way Systems</u> One way systems are no longer mandatory, but we will continue opening the old main entrance back door, so that people may be allowed to choose by which route they wish to exit from the church.
- 5. Stewards will sanitise the church at the end of mass. We shall therefore continue with two stewards.
- 6. **Holy Communion** No change please wait for the steward to guide you.
- 7. **Congregational singing inside** to be reviewed.
- 8. <u>The Offertory Collection</u> For the time being we will continue to ask the congregation to continue to use the baskets (and Dona Contactless facility at OLOL) at the entrance and exits from the churches.
