


expectations. You can read the story and see some pictures later in


Our club has donated \$300 to the local charity, *The House*, in December. Thanks to everyone who helped with their generous donations.



Wassail:

- 1 1/2 quart bottle Cranberry Juice Cocktail
- 2 1-qt bottles apple juice
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 3 cinnamon sticks
- 1 1/2 tsp whole cloves (tie in bag or use a teaball)

Combine all ingredients in pot and simmer for 90 minutes.

A history of Wassail:

Wassail is a beverage made from hot mulled cider and spices, drunk traditionally as an integral part of wassailing, an ancient English Yuletide drinking ritual and salutation either involved in door-to-door charity-giving or used to ensure a good cider apple harvest the following year.

Wassailing is a **Twelfth Night tradition** that has been practiced in Britain for centuries. It has its roots in a pagan custom of visiting orchards to sing to the trees and spirits in the hope of ensuring a good harvest the following season.

The Christmas spirit often made the rich a little more generous than usual, and bands of beggars and orphans used to dance their way through the snowy streets of England, offering to sing good cheer and to tell good fortune if the householder would give them a drink from his wassail bowl and let them stand for a few minutes beside the warmth of his hearth. The wassail bowl itself was a hearty combination of hot ale or beer, apples, spices and mead, just alcoholic enough to warm tingling toes and fingers of the singers.

Instant Hot Chocolate Mix Rebekah McDermott—1962

Sift together:

- 1 8 quart box of Carnation Instant Milk
- 1 pound jar of Cremora
- 1 pound Nestle's Quick Chocolate
- 1-2 cups sugar (can use sugar substitutes)
- 7 heaping tablespoons cocoa

Store in tightly closed jar til ready for use.

GERMAN CHOCOLATE BARS

Combine 11 oz. Kraft Caramels; 1/3 Cup evaporated milk, ½ cup butter and melt over low heat. (OR microwave these ingredients until melted and Blended)

Special Note: 5.33 fl oz small can of evaporated milk is the perfect size for this recipe.

Combine a Package German Chocolate Cake Mix, ³/₄ Cup Melted Butter (1 ½ Cube), 1/3 cup evaporated milk and 1 cup Chopped Walnuts.

Spread ½ mixture in buttered 9" X 13" pan.

Bake for 6 minutes at 350.

Remove from oven and sprinkle with 6 oz. chocolate chips. Spread caramel mixture on chips. Top with remaining batter.

Bake 18 minutes more. Cool. Cut and Refrigerate.
