From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Folks,

It feels like we just put the last of the Christmas decorations away and Lent is upon us! *What's up with that?* The beginning of Lent depends on the date of Easter. Easter follows a lunar, rather than a solar calendar and is celebrated on the Sunday that follows the first full moon after March 21, the vernal (spring) equinox. Therefore Easter cannot fall earlier than March 22 or later than April 25. Lent lasts for 40 days (not counting Sundays) and in many traditions (including ours!) starts with the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is an opportunity for the community to come together, recognize that we are at the beginning of a journey together, and start out toward Easter with the assurance of Jesus' forgiveness and presence in our lives. We use ashes made from last year's Palm Sunday celebration to mark us as fellow sojourners. The brittle palms burned up remind us of the ways in which our spirituality can dry up throughout the year when we neglect to follow in the footsteps of our Lord and "act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with our God." Fortunately, our Board of Deacons and Board of Missions have plans to help us rekindle that Spirit this season. Pay attention to what they have to offer, and try to check in on some of their opportunities.

This year we will gather for Ash Wednesday on February 10 at 6:30pm in the sanctuary. I hope you will join me in becoming marked for a remarkable time of discovery.

Drumroll, please! <u>\$105,000!</u>-the current total of pledges for 2016.

Add to that \$5,600 in advance giving (lump sum donations made at the beginning of the year), and \$2,000 collected in the Blue Envelope Head Start Challenge last fall, for a total of \$112,600, which is about \$6,000 over 2015 pledging.

We did this, together: each dollar pledged represents a prayer, a hope that each of us holds for making Jesus' love visible and active, in our lives and in our world. That's over 112,000 prayers!
