**Preschool:** Welcome April! Hopefully this month won't be too soggy, so we can go outside to play! This week we will talk about April and begin working on some fun things for Easter. Tomorrow we will begin learning how to write our numbers from 1-10. We have completely finished the letters of the alphabet, upper and lower case! We are working on our songs for our program. Lyrics for those will come home this week! Egg Coloring will be Weds, April 13<sup>th</sup>, at 6 pm! Please come and join the fun! - Miss Stacie

Kind: This week our theme is Seed to Plant. We have talked about living things and parts of a plant in Science, but we will learn more about seeds and plants, and their cycle this week. In math, we will be using tangrams, estimating weight and length using nonstandard units, graphing on a pictograph, and identifying the relationship between larger and smaller numbers. During Writing and Phonics, we will continue to expand on the phonics and writing rules we have already learned. An example of this is that at the end of a longer word, "y" says /ee/. Please be sure your child is getting some reading in while you are reading at home in the evenings. Practicing now and this summer will ensure that they are ready for first grade in August. 1st/2nd: We will continue working on our math skills this week with emphasis on counting money, telling time, and knowing our fact families. Second grade will continue working on Bossy Rs and adding details to our writing. First grade is adding "ai" and "ay" sounds this week. First grade will finish their science unit with a test on Thursday. I'm hoping second grade will finish their science unit with a test on Friday. Both classes will have a math facts test and spelling test on Friday.
