The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit provide much-needed self-care, critical germ fighting, and the chance to regain dignity amidst fear and uncertainty. **EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT CONTAINS:**

light-weight bath-size **TOWEL** (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended; bath-size bars of SOAP equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; adult-size **TOOTHBRUSH** in original packaging; sturdy COMB, remove packaging; metal NAIL CLIPPER. Pastor's Thoughts THE LAST DAYS

The above words put a person in mind of the idea that something is coming to an end. The things they hoped to do and planned to do now have an expiration date. I vaguely recall the feeling; the disappointment and frustration at not being able to realize all that one might have longed to enjoy and accomplish. Mitigating some of those feelings of loss is the excitement of seeing friends and others they might not get much of a chance to see during the summer months. That always seemed to take some of the edge off of the sorrow of the last days of summer freedom.

In many of the New Testament letters the writers make the point to the Christians to whom they are writing, that they are in point of fact already living in the Last Days. It sounds rather ominous but I do not think the intent was to put fear in their hearts. Actually, it seems likely those words were intended to be uplifting. Their trials and tribulations were not to go on forever.

Twenty centuries later we sometimes wonder how that could be true since they wrote about it so long ago and here we are. The Biblical writers understood the whole period of time beginning with the birth of Jesus as the last days because neither former prophecy nor new revelation concerning the history of salvation indicated the coming of another era before the return of Christ. We are indeed living in "the last days" to be followed by reuniting with loved ones forever in heaven.
