News of the possible opening of church buildings for private prayer has been released but communal worship of any kind is not currently scheduled until at least early July. The Minister and Steward Elders are in direct contact with Methodist Circuit, URC Mersey Synod and National Church and will update the congregation in due course as to progress and decisions on these matters which will require considerable organisation and will demand appropriate measures.

Please note that although the Government has announced some lifting of Covid 19 Regulations our buildings remain closed at this moment in time. Thank you.

Message from our Church Treasurer, Steve Elliott

As you are all aware at present we are not able to meet at our Church buildings, and sadly this may continue for some time yet. Nevertheless we do still need to maintain our premises so that our Ministry, outreach and service to God can continue, although obviously in a limited form.

Unfortunately there are expenses which continue during this period such as the utility bills, (gas electric water and telephone) the Church cleaning and maintenance, plus our insurances.

As we are not meeting we do not have our normal weekly offering, and because our premises are closed the Pre-school and other organisations that normally use our buildings are also no longer meeting so our rental income has also stopped.

We realise that many people regularly contribute by direct payments into the Church's bank account, and we hope that you will be able to continue to do this. But this is only a part of our normal income.

We are aware that the current situation is difficult for everyone and we have previously put a gentle request encouraging anyone who would normally put their offering on the plate, either in cash or envelope to if at all possible put the money aside ready for when we are able to return to Church.

As things have gone on for some while, it would now be helpful if anyone who normally put their money on the plate could consider one of a couple of alternatives if at all possible, which is either

A direct payment into the bank either regularly or on a one off basis.
