Thank you to our UFO Challenge Queens

Lois Bates and Nancy Shrout put their UFO Queen crowns into storage at the end of the March meeting. We are sad to see them go, but ever so grateful for their many years of cheerful, well-organized service.

Our delightful queens started the UFO Challenge in 2006 and have been running it ever since. Lois heard about the idea in one of her online quilting groups, and she recruited Nancy to join her. They appreciate the continued financial help from the Board, which allowed them to purchase prizes.

There have been a few changes over the years. The cost to sign up in 2006 was 25 cents; in 2019 it was \$2. Lois says, **"The first year we scheduled UFOs to be due in ten months.** After that, we had participants turn in quilts every other month, so six per year." A few things that never changed were the sight of their smiling faces and glittering crowns, the bowl of chocolate, and the crowd of eager participants at each meeting. Overall, our industrious PPQG members completed about 850 quilts. Lois and Nancy both finished all of the quilts on their list each year, so they did about 52 each.

The UFO Queens feel that every UFO Show and Tell was special, with members sharing stories about their completed projects. They are pleased that the members thanked them for having the UFO Challenges, and were delighted to encourage participants to finish their UFOs. The smiles of satisfaction were priceless.

Here are some words of wisdom for the next UFO Challenge organizers: "Have a set of rules and follow them and definitely have chocolate!"

meeting Joan Kelly received 15 quilts from Vicki Marsh, one each from Lois Bates and Pat McGough and Coleen Ortiz turned in a baby quilt, fifteen masks and twenty hearts. On April 14. a delivery was



made to Riverside Hospital of four lap quilts, thirteen baby quilts, fifteen masks and 75 fabric hearts. Joan Kelly knitted three throws and two baby hats which were delivered also. On March 24, Yvette and I made a delivery to CHKD. Twenty baby quilts and 135 fabric hearts were delivered. 133 of



the fabric hearts were made at a charity sew day at Sunshine Quilt Corner earlier this year. You can bring Service Projects to the Drive-thru meeting in May. We will continue to support Riverside and CHKD with baby quilts and fabric hearts for their NICUs.
