STAFFING

Minimal Officers to respond to emergencies

Fewer Officers present to deter unlawful behavior

Fewer specialty staff to fulfill programing requirements critical for rehabilitating the incarcerated

EQUIPMENT

BOP desperately needs technology to counter illegal cell phones

New legislation requires updating radio systems, cameras, public address systems

Officers have minimal equipment

LEADERSHIP

Past leadership has failed the Bureau, often leaving critical positions vacant

Contributed to increasingly dangerous environments by being reactive not proactive

BOP receives minimal training

FUNDING

BOP's budget does not allow for our prisons to be fully staffed

BOP's pay band is not comparable to other federal law enforcement agencies
