Chicken Run

We are glad to give the update that SOCH has now started raring chicken. The staff and children at the orphanage are extremely grateful to the donors of the funds to establish the chicken project, the IWCN Charity Committee in Geneva, and Mrs Greenhalgh, the mother of Henry who was on the 2012 Collège du Léman trip to Serenje. Chicken meat will help improve the diet of the children by adding proteins and lipids for body building and energy giving respectively. The surplus chicken will be sold so that restocking is done and profits are made. Chicken manure is very good in adding fertility to the garden. So, Manure is being used in the garden and better vegetables are expected to be harvested from the garden.
