

Ride Report Cambooya 5th January 2014

As most of you are aware I am not the most confident Ride Leader in the branch. For some reason I find it hard to find my way around the country myself let alone guiding a highly excitable group of older motorcyclists. Never mind I had put my hand up so there was no backing out now. It was decided that this was to be the inaugural testing of the BBQ trailer that the branch had purchased and I was confident that it would live up to the hype that I had thrusted upon it.

Amanda and I did the normal pre-ride test in our car (in the air conditioning) on the Saturday before just to make sure that I really did know where I was going, and to check out the fuel situation. The roads were in pretty good nick, no road works for the first part of the journey but some on the highway on the way back from Toowoomba. The main decision being, do we back track down the same hill coming home or take the chance we were not going to be held up too much after the range and take the highway.


it does not turn out exactly how you planned it, you are the only one to know anyway and the branch will love you for giving them a day to remember.

Hoping you all had a very joyous and happy Christmas and New Year. Have been in Nepal for just under two weeks now and am preparing to move on to Cambodia tomorrow. Nepal is a wonderful place although the trek up towards Everest is less than easy and, for us, definitely a once in a lifetime event. We didn't go all the way to base camp (had never planned to anyway), in fact we probably only went about half way and stopped at a place called Namchee Bazaar with a day trek from there taking us up to about the 4,000 metre mark and providing a spectacular view of Everest and other parts of the Himalayas. Was pretty happy to get that far and pleased to head back down the hill. Was gobscmacked when we crossed paths with a Sherpa carrying a refrigerator on his back up a steep part of the track we struggled with only days before with nothing more than a backpack on our backs. All in all a good experience and one off the bucket list.

Back to Kathmandu and the hustle and bustle of a crowded and developing (albeit slowly) Asian City of approx 10,000,000 people. Traffic is a nightmare with more bikes that you can poke a stick at. Mostly scooters,125s and a few 250s but there is a number of Enfield bullets and even saw a Yammy Drag Star. In the short time we have been here we have also seen a few offs although nothing too serious due to the slow speeds and congestion. Enough to draw a good crowd though. Was surprised to see my first 135 cc motorcycle although I have no idea what breed it was. Suspect some form of Indian made machine.

Well, head for Cambodia tomorrow for a bit of warm weather and half pride cocktails at our favourite guest house before heading home around the 17th. Will hopefully catch up with some of you in the 19th or at the February meeting.
