What does it mean to observe a holy Lent at a bus stop? What constituents communal worship? If it's not in a church, does it count? Are we watering down the commitment? Are liturgical seasons meaningful in the second decade of the 21st century or is the Church hanging on to tired customs obstinately oblivious that the world has moved on?

I'm writing this before the final service of Ash Wednesday. This morning, Valerie Colbert, our intern to the Deaconate and I went to the Huntersville Park and Ride to pray over folk and mark their foreheads with ashes. Some participants were bus riders,

four were our members who would not make the later services. A few more people not connected with St. Mark's knew it was our tradition to show up between 7:00 and 9:00 and came to receive an early start to the season. This is the seventh year we've offered Ashes to Go! Our first year, people were reluctant to make eye contact. Now they smile, nod their head, say good morning. Several ask questions. This year a new element was added. A businessman took pictures of us with his phone. I wonder where it will be posted and more interesting, how it will be captioned.

I have colleagues who argue, *Ashes to Go* is bad church practice. It isn't a real service. It isn't done in the context of a stable community. I've had my own reservations but here's what I've noticed over the years. Some people have a deep or nagging desire to connect with this time of self-examination and call to do better, be better with the help of the God they love. They are relieved they can make a good start on the designated day because a way is made to meet them where they are. They are sincere. They are thankful.

For folk not interested in prayers or ashes for the season, they are somehow surprised and obviously relieved when they see faithful folk dressed in religious garb in the public square being easy and respectful. They appreciate that we smile or nod back. We make no sudden moves on them. We don't thrust a pamphlet into their hands. We are approachable but not intrusive. Through the years I've hoped but haven't known for sure if we'd be effective Christian witnesses by just being present. We are.

Standing where we did, we could see commuters running late, running to catch the bus before it pulled off. It was easy to ask the driver to hold up. The breathless were grateful. Their day began easier than it could have because Christian folk did a kind thing.

Ashes to Go isn't beautiful liturgy but it is humbling witness. It seems a good start way to a season of realignment with one who came for the whole world.

# SLOW COOKER CRACK CHICKEN CHILI INGREDIENTS:

2 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
1 (11 or 15-oz) can corn, drained
1 (15-oz) can black beans, drained and rinsed
1 (10-oz) can diced tomatoes and green chilies,
undrained
2 cups chicken broth
1 cup cooked, chopped bacon
1 (1-oz) packet Hidden Valley Ranch Original seasoning & salad dressing mix
1 tsp cumin

Then chili nowe

1 Tbsp chili powder

1 tsp onion powder

1 (8-oz) package cream cheese

1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

2-3 Jalapenos, seeded & diced

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Place chicken at bottom of slow cooker.
- Add corn, black beans, diced tomatoes and green chilies, chicken broth, cumin, chili powder, onion powder ranch seasoning and bacon. Stir together. Place cream cheese on top of chicken.
- 3. Cover with lid and cook on LOW for 6-8 hours.
- 4. Remove chicken from slow cooker and shred with 2 forks. Return to slow cooker. Slowly stir cheddar cheese into chili.



#### **New Building Update**

In mid December we began the application process with Mecklenburg County for our Building Permit.

In mid January our application was reviewed and several questions were raised, only one with particular significance. With due diligence of our architect this issue was re-

solved with little impact in our original planning. Other minor issues were handled by our Civil Engineer.

We are re-submitting our application next week and I hope for final permit approval within 30 days. We will finalize our construction schedule after permit approval. Groundbreaking should begin 30 days after construction planning.

We are also planning on Founders Hall renovation this summer -- so lots of construction is planned for our summer and fall.
