Ponderings From The Pastor

"E**R®NENT#AL H®RE [Part Two] F®R LENT"

LOVE IS AT THE BOTTOM...THE FOUNDATION!



My column last month was long. I'll try and keep it a *bit* shorter this month—two pages instead of three!—but still to the point!

Last month I wrote about sweeping changes which our culture (and the Church as part of it) have been going through for some time now. I said that we—the congregation of St. Paul UCC—must learn to SEE and DEAL with change differently...even learning to EMBRACE it, and let go of our FEAR about the future. I reminded all of us that "perfect love drives out all fear," and that God "works for good in all things for those who love

God." I then suggested that we must NOT BE AFRAID of what the future holds for us!...not if we put our money where our mouths are, radically trust God, follow Jesus, and accept change as not just inevitable but as necessary.

I wrote about the "Great Emergence" which the Church Universal has entered; the "Age of the Spirit" we find ourselves in...a strange time in which local congregations of every "tribe" are shrinking and dying, but people are spiritually hungry, clamoring for meaning and purpose as much (if not more) than ever before. It's the end of institutional religion as we've known it...but NOT the end of faith. Once again—be not afraid! The "end of Church" as we know it is bringing the BIRTH of something new...and if we GRASP this time as a time of newness and "birth," we will have a powerful and healthy future! Remember this quote from Diane Butler Bass (from Christianity After Religion):

Will there still be Christianity after the end of institutional religion? Yes, there will be. But it is going to be different than what Americans have known, a faith responsive to the longings of those who are expecting more spiritual depth and greater ethical integrity rather than more conventional church. Indeed, I suspect that the end of church is only the beginning of a new Great Awakening.

So. Lets get busy! Time for an Awakening! Let's chase after **more spiritual depth** and **greater ethical integrity** at St. Paul UCC! Let's dream together a bit, as we ponder what that might look like...

EVERY member of our church engages in some kind of partnered spiritual growth—a Bible study, a prayer group, meditation groups, book studies, new adult classes, even online learning opportunities; we MULTIPLY many options for spiritual growth, as we all AGREE that Sunday worship alone is NOT enough...that we ALL have to "go deeper" and find "more spiritual depth"... because we recognize that our future DEPENDS upon it.

- YES, in case you missed it: EVERY MEMBER, regardless of age—no exceptions!
- We add a second, ALTERNATIVE style of worship—a new service, maybe on Sunday, maybe on a
 weeknight—a service which is NOT for us, but for those who are NOT HERE already;
- We fearlessly confront any and all "-isms" which hurt our congregational ethos and integrity (racism, homophobia, sexism, fear of other religions)—we learn to daily PRACTICE the Great Commandment: love God with all you have and all you are, and love your neighbor as yourself (see Bullet Number One!); we engage in thoughtful, soulful congregational HEALING activities, including special worship services and prayer meetings.
- We stop worrying about "small stuff," like coffee in the Sanctuary, using a SCREEN with lyrics on it, using new kinds of instruments, adding a new DIGITAL church sign out front, etc.—and we SPEND MONEY to make happen all of the above, fearlessly tapping "reserve" funds to grow... because we STOP worrying about that proverbial "rainy day" and recognize that our ship is already IN THE FLOOD of change—and we want to pilot the ship rather than watch it flounder out of control.
- We TREAT ONE ANOTHER, <u>ALWAYS</u>, with the dignity, respect, and the personal integrity of a Christ
 -follower: when we have a problem we GO DIRECTLY (one on one) to the source rather than
 complaining behind someone's back...we refuse to gossip and to judge other people, instead viewing
 them as if in a mirror, with compassion and understanding ("walk in their shoes"), and we PRACTICE
 FORGIVENESS and HUMILITY as regular spiritual disciplines (see Bullet Number One!)...we DAILY
 pray for one another, our leaders, and our church.
- We LET GO OF THE PAST as we grow in understanding that the past GUARANTEES US NOTHING...that we certainly do stand on the shoulders of all who've gone before us—as those forbearers did too, all the while laboring to break new ground (literally at times) in creating their own future—and so must we...as we continue learning the difference between honoring tradition (good) and serving traditionalism (i.e., idolatry, bad). And...we ERASE from our congregational lexicon those famous "Seven Last Words" of the Church: "We never did it that way before!"
- We give "YES" every possible opportunity...and kick "NO" to the curb whenever/however we can.
- We learn to accept—each and every one of us!!—that theology, doctrines and rituals ALWAYS change over time, and always have...that the Bible is the living word of God, but not "God's literal words," and that it's a book less about God than about how humans have (often quite badly) understood God—and that this understanding evolves and changes as you read through the Bible. We accept that the Bible is limited, sometimes flawed, and OFTEN hard to understand...and that our own understanding of scripture requires our very best effort (see Bullet Number One!).
- We seek—each and every one of us!!—God's help, mercy, and forgiveness EVERY time we find ourselves demanding the church serve "ME"...having forgotten that we are all here to serve God chiefly by serving others...that the church is more an outpost of grace than a Sunday morning social club...while at the same time having more fun in church, loosening and lightening up, laughing more, taking ourselves less seriously, and celebrating one another!
- We resolve—each and every one of us!!—to LOVE MORE: to intentionally embody, mirror and reflect GOD'S love to others...starting in our own families and with our fellow church members. And, we anchor this resolve in grasping God's full embrace and unconditional Love for *ourselves*!

Ponderings From The Pastor (continued)

We already know what that Love looks like: read **1 Corinthians 13** again—that famous passage which ends like this: "So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love."

Our common future will be discerned in Love, rooted in Love, sustained by Love, and endlessly grow in and share Love. Now, I'm not talking about a wimpy, sickly-sweet, sentimental, romantic, Hollywood-ending-type love...but a *powerful* Cross-bearing, hate-ending, peace-bringing, justice-demanding, evil-confronting, reconciling, healing, world-uniting, **exponentially-hopeful** Love! This kind of love casts out ALL fear....and it is the ONLY thing that can. It's a patient, kind, humble Love, full of goodwill, easy-going, forgiving, selfless, rejoicing in truth. It is **Perfect Love**—GOD—which (or should I say Who) is the FOUNDATION of every other kind of love!

We must let Perfect Love embrace us...envelope us...change and transform us...motivate us...equip us...and SEND us. There is not one of us who doesn't need this Love, and its transforming embrace. And because I know and ACCEPT this Love—even though it's challenging, and at times even daunting and incomprehensible (in human terms!), I am willing and unafraid to go where it—where GOD—takes us. Last but not least, any *lingering* fear I have in my shadow parts...well...I resolve to try and give that up this year for Lent! And invite Jesus into my heart...again...for the umpteenth time!

Present: Mike Bartholomew, Rev. Barry Bordenkircher, Linda Woods, Margaret Maybury, Marge Fassnacht, Anne Zimmer, Jan Apro, Nancy Klusmeier.

Mike Bartholomew called the meeting to order at 7:05 P.M. Pastor Barry offered an opening prayer. Nancy Klusmeier asked Council to review the minutes of the October 16th Council Meeting. A **MOTION** was made (Fassnacht/Maybury) to approve said minutes. **MOTION PASSED** and the minutes were approved as printed.

Sr. Minister's Report (Rev. Barry Bordenkircher)

- Pastor Barry submitted to Council his Summary Report of mileage and time spent for the period 10/23 11/20/17.
- Virginia is out of Good Samaritan Hospital and is at Coventry Village. She is doing pretty well.
- Mike Cornish is out of Good Sam with fractured vertebrae.
- Rick Davis is in rehab for his knee replacement. He is still in a lot of pain in rehab.
- Lucille Walters had a stroke and fell and the church wasn't notified.
- Funeral today for Al Molter.
- Nursery School Summit went well and will have another after the 1st of the year.
- We hosted MARCC Planning last week. Mike, Nancy and Joan helped out. There were very good reviews and they praised our church and the people.
- The water issue (flood) in the lower level has been cleaned up. Rick is looking into getting some reimbursement from MSD. Mike mentioned getting traps so we won't get sewer back-up. Brandon's group came pretty quick. Mike B. and Jim worked hard cleaning up also.
- The Disciple Bible Study is off and running with 14 participants.
- The Cafe' continues to gain popularity. We've had over \$40 in donations for coffee so far. We need to advertise it (FB, Instagram, etc.).
- He attended the Fall SONKA meeting with Joan Allen and Cheryl B.
- Finished the Stewardship material/packet for distribution.

TEAM REPORTS

<u>Care Team</u> (Marge Fassnacht)

- Marge reported that she is working on setting up a meeting with her Team.
- There was a meeting with the Zone last week. They have come up with the money to hire someone and the job has been posted. They hope to open after the 1st of the year (January 8 or 22nd).
- She is working on doling out money from the 2017 Budget and also working on the 2018 Budget.
- The Grant from Marathon Oil may not come through since Tom Bryant isn't working.
- Community Dinner There was a misunderstanding between Paul and Judith regarding Boy Scouts working the dinner on the 2nd Tuesday. Anne said the Boy Scouts are working the 2nd Tuesday dinner. Discussion regarding if there was a cleaning schedule for the kitchen. Marge will check with Sonya and Paul.

Facilities Team

- Rick got a 2nd estimate for the roof.
- Mike bought 2 new routers for WIFI in Fellowship Hall, Narthex and Chapel (had 1 already). The Sanctuary should play off of the Narthex WIFI.

Facilities Team (Continued)

- The pads for the humidifier for the Grand Piano need replacing. We have 2 extra pads and Jimmy can do
 it.
- Mark H. is working on the parking lot lights situation putting on a timer.
- Pastor Barry asked who plows if we have snow. Ryan Davis plows and they will come automatically.
 Discussion regarding problem with sidewalk snow removal.

<u>Finance Team</u> (Margaret Maybury)

- Margaret reported that she hasn't done anything with the pledges yet.
- Every week we come up short. We need to make a lot of cuts. We had to borrow money again. Jan said he's already talked to lawn cutters about coming every other week.
- Congregational Meeting on Budget is set for January 28th.

Treasurer's Report (Anne Zimmer)

- Anne submitted to Council copies of the Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual and the Balance Sheet for October.
- We are getting something from the Grace Lienhart Estate but don't know amount yet.
- Everything is paid but we had to borrow to do it.
- As always, copies of financial reports are available in the office for anyone who wishes to see them.

Endowment Report (Jan Apro)

- We borrowed \$30,000 from Vocation Fund to pay bills.
- The stock market is doing great. Broker told him it is expected to go up significantly near the end of the year.
- Balance of church and Vocation Funds is \$239,529.49 as of end of October.

Nurture Team (Linda Woods)

- Linda reported that her Team met tonight.
- They finished 36 shoe boxes for Samaritan's Purse last week and took them to Mt. Healthy Baptist Church (collection point). Alice Graber and daughter and granddaughter helped out.
- School Uniform donations are needed. Care Team helps with this and Lynn K. purchases uniforms.
- Christmas Play is December 17. The Sunday School Christmas Party is the 24th. The new curriculum
 has gone over well and will need to purchase winter version. No Sunday School in December because of
 all the activities.

Worship Team (Nancy Klusmeier for Vicky Ritz)

- Nancy reported for Vicky that Worship Team was involved in the Ingathering on Sunday, November 19th. The food was gathered and will be distributed to 3 families from our area along with turkeys for their Thanksgiving dinners. The remaining food will be distributed to our community dinner supplies and the Mt. Healthy Alliance will receive some. (Turkeys were donated to the church for the families through the help of Judith).
- The Christmas season is upon us. This Sunday, November 26th, we will decorate the church for the holidays. All that can help will be appreciated. We are having a Christmas Eve Candlelight Service. Music starts at 4:30 and service at 5:00. We may have a flautist to play.
- Mike reported that the Advent Wreath is in the stairwell by the Nursery School. Discussion regarding replacing candles. We can fix up existing candles to look OK and save \$60.

Worship Team (Continued)

- Worship Team is still looking for ushers.
- We had an All Saints Day Memorial Service.

Vice President's Report (Jan Apro)

- Jan reported that he created all new safety and emergency policies and procedures for the Nursery School. These procedures were given to the Nursery School and teachers, pastor and Police and Fire Departments have OK'd them.
- He is working on policy for our church to protect members. This is in response to church shootings. They seem to go after small churches.

A **MOTION** was made (Apro/Klusmeier) to authorize anyone who has a concealed carry permit to carry a gun at church if it is concealed. **MOTION PASSED.** (Linda and Margaret abstained from voting.) Jan will check to see if anyone who carries has a permit.

Discussion regarding a letter sent home to Nursery School parents regarding Nursery School letting parents come in the side door. The church needs to be told this stuff in advance. This needs to stop as there is a danger. Door has been left unlocked. Last year starting times were staggered. Why not this year?

Lay Minister's Report

- Joan sent her report that the classes are going great. Numbers have been steady 2-3 in Little Angels, 5
 -8 in middle room and her class has 4-7. Sunday School X-mas Party will be on December 24th.
- Christmas Play will be December 17th. Diane and Anne and Cheryl (she believes) are working on updating costumes. Trudy will be assisting along with Dolly and Kim.
- SPY December lock-in is the 8th and 9th. Plan is to go caroling. She is calling Twin Towers today (want to see Ruth Meisner).
- Kids will be available to help decorate the church on the 26th. She also signed the SPY up to do Advent reading on the 17th.
- Children's Moments are set until the end of December.
- The Custer has been moved to November 30th at First Church in College Hill.
- The Tuesday Night Dinners have picked back up. The numbers are around 100. We have a few new people working, which is great.
- Mark H. is planning on working on the electric issue in Joan's office in the next couple of weeks. There is only one good outlet which keeps blowing the fuse.

NEW BUSINESS

- Pastor Barry discussed with Council the state of the UCC Ohio Conference. SONKA may phase out and be replace by a conference structure.
- Marge brought up that if the church goes down, everything goes to SONKA. Pastor Barry said that is not true. It is our property and money to do with what we want. Jan asked for that in writing. Pastor Barry said he would check into it.
- Discussed Council having Christmas Dinner out somewhere. Will follow up with an e-mail. Mike will look into it.
