

Romans 8: 18-27

Future Glory



The other day I rang up a business with a question.

The person answering the phone said 'Don't worry if you hear some noises. I'm working from home.' But she efficiently dealt with my query. Work, home and leisure may have been in three different places in the past. "Working from home"

means the division is less clearly defined. In a similar way the three headings below are not separate areas of our lives. They overlap.

Suffering is seen in creation. In verse 20 it is "subjected to futility" and in verse 21 "as in bondage to decay". We experience this in climate change. The sin of Adam and Eve has its consequences in the problems we experience in creation. We ourselves also experience suffering (v.23) and groan inwardly (or even outwardly!). It can be physically, mentally or as we try to cope with the difficulties of life.



Anticipating is also the experience of Paul. In v.18 he says, "I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us". Alongside suffering we anticipate the "Future Glory" which will one day be ours in a New Creation. That will bring freedom from the suffering in creation and in ourselves. In verse 25 Paul says "we wait for it with patience".

Waiting is not always easy. What happens while we are waiting? Verses 26 & 27 tells us not as much about what we do, but about what the Holy Spirit does. Even Paul writes about weakness and not knowing how to pray. God by His Spirit searches our hearts. Often in hospital, people have a scan to see what is happening inside them. The Spirit can scan our lives, but we need to give space for it to happen. He may do it through the Bible, a hymn or

space for it to happen. He may do it through the Bible, a hymn of song or another Christian. Sometimes when we pray, we bring God our agenda of things to pray about. God's agenda may be different. We need to allow God's Spirit to intercede for us "according to the will of God" (verse 27).
