## STATEMENT IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE COMPLAINT

A case and controversy exists between the Plaintiffs Alice Burns, Laurence Goodman, and Kenneth Gomez, Governor of New Mexico and the Defendants California, Colorado and New Mexico Governments and select persons fraudulently posing as federal officers within the Ninth and Tenth Circuits in violation of the Ethics in Government Act of 1978. They ask leave to file within the meaning of Article III and the First Amendment of the Constitution of the United States of America in that:

A. The Plaintiffs are aggressively claiming, asserting the exclusive actively Amendment right to peaceably assemble seeking redress of their grievances from the United States Government; they have informed the President of the United States of America by letter of the insurgency without effect; they have prevented Plaintiff Gomez from taking office as Governor of New Mexico with armed might: they have a right to be free from an involuntary hybrid type system of peonage imposed upon them by the insurgents posing as state and federal public officers who deny constitutional powers in general and specifically the Thirteenth and Fourteenth of the power Amendments. and simultaneously defv authorities of 14 Stat. 27, 14 Stat. 546, and 17 Stat. 13: the former being a statute giving effect to the Thirteenth Amendment and overriding presidential veto which was later reinforced by 17 Stat. 13 giving effect to the Fourteenth Amendment.

- B. Said insurgents hold Plaintiffs to conditions of servitude against their free will:
- a. That deny them the effect of their political voices for the duration of the full terms of elective office when exercised during all election processes for determining who shall constitutionally control their course of conduct by either not constitutionally or lawfully entering the office sought,
- b. That the insurgent forces deprive them of an enduring *economic stake* in the use of money collected from them in various schemes for taxes and fees which is spent in support of the insurgents' felonious activities with self-asserted and imposed immunity, and
- c. That the insurgents have readily available armed might for establishing, maintaining and enforcing Plaintiffs' obedience.
- C. Furthermore, the Plaintiffs assert they are formal, independent, and mutually exclusive witnesses of the continuously manipulated acts of treason harming them and brought about by the foregoing persons posing as public officers; they demand that the Court exercise its superintending control to terminate the felonious acts of the insurgents against both constitutions offending the United States Government; the States of California, Colorado and New Mexico; and Plaintiffs' humanity.
- D. Finally, the Plaintiffs are faced with a common and unsolvable dilemma. No court of law readily available to them within the federal and state judicial arenas at federal circuit levels and below are competent to determine that those persons unconstitutionally and unlawfully posing as state

and federal judicial officers and the executive law enforcing officers in place to provide remedies foreclosing the dilemma are felons; they either falsified their reports required for the commissioning processes, perjured their commissioning oaths, thereafter embezzled publicly appropriated funds received as salaries and converted for personal use; and they thereby jointly and severally conspired as an oligarchy to effect the object of that conspiracy by unlawfully issuing orders decrees, judgments harming Plaintiffs or by refusing to act in a law enforcing capacity against the felons in accord with the oaths taken.

Plaintiffs hereby respectfully submit that the Motion for Leave to File the Complaint should be granted.
