Preschool: THANK YOU for going with us to the corn maze last Friday. The kids had a wonderful time! Thanks for making it possible! This week we will wrap up learning about the letter 'c'. We will also be talking about fire safety. Talk with your child about a plan in case of a fire at your house! **Don't forget!** Friday we are going to Food for America. We plan to leave Hudson at 8:45. We will dismiss at Food for America. Any questions, please ask. I will need a couple of drivers for this. This month is full of fun things! Kind: This week we will focus on Three Little Bears. Our vocabulary words this week are porridge, cooled, peek, trust, and frightened. In math this week we will focus on acting out story problems, identifying ordinal positions to fourth, covering designs using pattern blocks, sequencing daily events, and identifying, describing, and comparing triangles and squares. During phonics, we will review a, i, s, t, p, n, c, k, e, and introduce h and r. Handwriting will be focused on letters c, e, and f. Have a great week! - **Mrs. Stewart**

1st/2nd: First grade is doing great at writing their own sentences! This week we are reading the story, Little Red Riding Hood, by Candice Ransom. This being a fairytale, we will be talking about fairy tales and reading a few others throughout the week. We will be working on identifying the characters, setting, and major events in a story and comparing different versions of Little Red Riding Hood. Please continue reading at home. Practice, practice, practice! In math we are working on adding numbers up to 18. We are also working on reading and writing numbers to 18. An easy way to practice is in the car. Give your child some math problems. This is an easy way to get them fluent on their facts! In 2nd grade we are reading the story, Stellaluna, by Janell Cannon. We will work problem/solution in the story and continue

with verbs this week. We will read a nonfiction passage about bats that ties in perfectly with our unit in science over life cycles! In math we are continuing to work on fact families, but will be adding more subtraction to our work; so you will hear words such as less than and least. We will also start talking about/learning/counting pennies and dimes. This is something you can work on anytime you go anywhere! Everything costs money. - Mrs. Thomas

3rd/4th: Welcome back! I hope everyone was able to get out and enjoy the wonderful weather we had this weekend. This week our class will finish our unit on nouns and will be moving on to verbs in Language Arts. Our first AR deadline is quickly approaching, so please make sure students are reading nightly. Both third and fourth grade will have math tests tomorrow. Please be looking at and reading student's planners. There are nights that I assign XtraMath and it is not getting completed. I do this, so students get extra exposure to their math facts. Students will have more success in math when they get older, if we are diligent in teaching them basic math facts now. Please practice with them as much as possible. Even a little bit each night can help. - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: In Writing, 6th graders will start their Patriot's Pen essays this week. In Science, 5th grade will have a test over Ch. 1 on Thursday and 6th grade will be getting ready to test over Ch. 1 next week. In English, both grades will be looking at possessive nouns. In Reading, students will start a new Lit. Circle over the book "Bridge to Terabithia" by Katherine Paterson. In Social Studies, 5th grade will be looking at the causes of the American Revolution and 6th grade will read about the Native Americans of the Great Plains and Eastern Woodlands.
