## AP US History Exam Breakdown

The AP U.S. History Exam is 3 hours and 15 minutes long and includes both a 95minute multiple-choice/short answer section and a 100-minute free-response section. Each section is divided into two parts, as shown in the table below. Student performance on these four parts will be compiled and weighted to determine an AP Exam score.

The course is structured around the investigation of course themes and key concepts in NINE chronological periods. These periods, from pre-Columbian contacts in North America (represented symbolically by the date 1491) to the present, provide a temporal framework for the course. The instructional importance and assessment weighting for each period varies:
