A parishioner in a previous parish came to me every year with his young daughter to arrange an annual Mass for the donor of his kidney.

One person's death, and the consent of his/her family enabled a dramatic improvement in the health of at least one person.

Steve Jobs of Apple needed a transplant. A Californian, he was on the waiting list in California and one other State. A suitable donor turned up in that other State, and Steve could use his plane to be flown to the hospital in time to get that transplant. He got some extra years of life ("I'm vertical!" he said at an Apple event when people were wondering about his state of health.)

In a sense that wasn't fair, and Steve knew it - not many have immediate access to an aircraft. So he did something about it: he backed a campaign to encourage organ donation, and the group was successful. California changed its application form for a driver's licence: now there's a question about whether you're willing to be a donor.

Yes or No, you have to answer.

In Ireland, you're asked a similar question but you don't have to answer! You can just skip over it. (If I'm wrong, I'd love to be corrected.)

Organ donation is in the news again these days. We thank donors and would-be donors, and pray for them. New organs bring new life to recipients and their families.
