### WHAT DOES IT COST TO PUT ON A QUILT SHOW?

The biggest expense is, of course, the venue. To rent the Berry Center or the Merrell Center is approximately \$15,000 for the 3 days. This includes the use of the entire Conference Center, Atrium and a couple of classrooms. To pole and drape for hanging the quilts and to separate vendor spaces is another \$4,000. Vendor space rental and attendance hopefully will cover these two largest expenses. The \$10 entry fee you pay to have your quilt judged, usually covers the cost of the 3 judges. We need to sell all the tickets for the donation quilt and have an attendance of at least 1,000 to make any money on the show. More than anything we need you to volunteer to help make this our biggest and best quilt show ever!

### **DONATION TICKET SALES**

If you have sold all your tickets, please turn in your money by the December guild meeting. Tickets are still available to be picked up, so if you haven't picked up any, please see me at the November guild meeting and pick up at least \$50 worth. If would be wonderful, it all the printed tickets were sold and we had to order more for the quilt show.


