The health services included 30 laboratory blood draws and 38 pints of blood donated to the United Blood Services of Albuquerque.

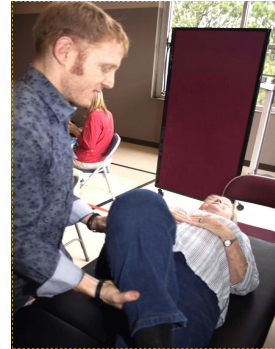
