Join the celebration of the U.S. Army Birthday on 14 June as we remember its creation in 1775. The Army originally consisted of volunteer Soldiers with roots to the Continental Army - and was formed to fight the Revolutionary War. Today, as the largest branch of the U.S. military, the proud men and women of the U.S. Army continue to provide peace and security for all of us. 14 June also commemorates Flag Day. This day celebrates the adoption of the flag of the United States on 14 June 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The resolution stated: "Resolved, That the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation." Knowing our history is extremely important as each one of you have made your mark on history with your selfless service to our great Nation. Teaching your children and grandchildren your history is even more important. The glory days of your military service will be lost to time if you don't tell your story to your children, your grandchildren, your neighbors, and your friends here at Post 624. Come visit us! Come share your memories with people just like you who served the Nation!!
