





Stockport Sunday School

When the Industrial Revolution came to Stockport children were working long hours, 6 days a week, in the mills. Then there were no day schools. Matthew Mayer aware that these children could not read or write bought a piece of land on Hillgate in 1777, had houses built with the idea of using the upper rooms to start a Sunday School.

The Sunday School grew rapidly from 1784 and more houses were built, where grammar, writing and arithmetic were taught. Matthew Mayer's son Joseph became a teacher and proposed a large school. Meetings were held in St Mary's, Stockport Parish Church, to plan the building in the Parish.

The large building on the corner of Wellington Street and Duke Street became Stockport Sunday School and was opened in 1806 and later extended. At one time 2000 people were taught there using the Bible to learn their reading and writing.

Over the years there were many links with St Mary's and S.S.S. (as it was often called). When Joseph Mayer died the muffled St Mary's bells were tolled over 3000 times. By 1970 the building was becoming dilapidated and too big for current needs, so the congregation left St Mary's parish and relocated to Heaviley. A new "Joseph Mayer" building was opened in 1974.

The connection remained with St Mary's and since becoming Rector Roger has preached at various services, at least annually.

When Acquinas College wanted to acquire the "Joseph Mayer" building, the Sunday School built another one. "Compass Point", a new build virtually next door and Roger was invited to dedicate it.

We now have a Bishop of Stockport! Bishop Libby was installed in Chester Cathedral on Sunday 8th March, and greeted with rapturous applause as Bishop Peter presented her to the capacity congregation, which included the Mayor and Mayoress of Stockport and the



Chief Executive of Stockport Borough Council, all sitting on the front row!

Our new Bishop is under no illusions that her job as a Bishop, and as the first woman Bishop in the Church of England is going to be a very hard task, in the days ahead. She needs and covets the prayers and love of all people of faith and the support of those who genuinely believe that the church has made the right decision in making her a Bishop.

We will certainly be praying for our new Bishop of Stockport regularly, and we look forward to welcoming her to St. Mary's one day.
