Read the candidate responses below to get to know them.

THE CANDIDATE FOR PRESIDENT - Kim Perkins

- 1. I have been a member for over 3 years. I have served on nominating committee, volunteered at a craft fair, helped set up for day of sharing.
- 2. I have served on several committees as chair at Jacksonville Board Of REALTORS. I have also have served as a board of Director, PresidentElect and President Of JBOR. I had formal training on Robert's Rules. I am a graduate of NC REALTORS Leadership Academy. In the leadership academy we had training with professionals on different levels of leadership skills. I have served on committees at state level and on presidential advisory groups. I have attend National meetings also. I am current President of my HOA and have been a board member for 11 years. I am past president elect (vice president) Of Crystal Coast Women's Council of REALTORS. I am a current member of Toastmasters. I am Past Vice President of Public Relations for our local Toastmasters.
- 3. I am here to serve the membership and guide the ship the direction the membership wants.

THE CANDIDATE FOR VICE PRESIDENT - Jane Mitchell

- 1. I had joined CPNQG back in 2003 and was a member for 4 years. I was Vice President, Quilt committee, Programs and Teaching. I had to drop out in2007 due to divorce and raised my sons. I re-joined the guild during the Jenny Doan event and have helped the guild with the first Day of Sharing. I was on the committee in charge of the raffle baskets for the 1st and 2nd year. I switched to membership committee chair for 2 years and this past year have made several items for the Craft booth.
- 2. I started sewing at 8years old. My mom made me make a skirt and reversible vest. I ended up making blankets for my Holly Hobby dolls and friends. Help make my halloween costumes as well. I've made curtains, cushion covers and other craft items since then. When I was living in Maryland, I was pregnant with my first child, 1988, my mom had gotten into quilting at that point and had me make a baby quilt for my daughter. I started when I was pregnant and she got it when she was 28! lol Anyway, I had dabbled in quilting and again crafts and home decor. When we were stationed at El Toro Marine Corp Air Station in California in 1996 I was near Quilt in A Day. My mom came to stay with me when I had my son Cody in 1996 and she waved Eleanors Log Cabin book at me and said, "her address is here in California. San Marcos was about an hour south of me (more like 4 hours California Freeway time)". We drove down there and they were having a Kids Quilt camp. Long story longer, the next year the base closed and we got moved to Camp Pendleton in Oceanside, CA, 30 minutes from Quilt in a Day. I signed my daughter up and when I was picking her up one day I said to an employee how much fun it would be to work there and she said we are hiring a part time person. (continued)

I applied and got the job. I worked for Eleanor for 3 years in that time I got certified as a Quilt in a Day Instructor, worked many quilt shows with them. As an employee, we got taught by Eleanor as pattern testers. I got to go to Paducah, Ky for the APQS show with them for 6 years. We had gotten stationed here at New River MCAS in 2002 and that's when I met Kirsta. We opened All About Quilting and sold Elna Sewing Machines, fabric and of course Quilt in A Day books. I always take classes to learn new techniques and pass on the information I learn to others.

3. I feel that I am open to help anyone enhance their quilting experience.

THE CANDIDATE FOR VICE PRESIDENT - Missy Pierce

- 1. I have been a member since 2019. I'm currently chair for retreat.
- 2. I sat on the Okinawa quilt guild board for three years. Two years as Treasurer and one year as Vice President. I sat on the Lejeune High School theater booster club board for four years. Two years as Treasurer, one year as Treasurer/Secretary and one year as Vice President.

THE CANDIDATE FOR SECRETARY - Sue Miller


Guild Sew Day - October 10th

<u>Class 1</u> A class is planned with Teresa Manning, President of Thread of the Pungo Guild. The class is <u>Fine Tuning The Art of Sewing Curves Within Quilt Blocks</u>. Open to all quilting levels. The cost is \$10 and will be paid directly to Teresa before the class starts. Please note: <u>The class will go at 9:30 – 11:30 am with doors opening at 9 am. During this timeframe, the fellowship hall will only be opened to members taking the class.</u> Doors will open at 11:30 for our regular sew day. Additional details will be sent out later next week.


If you would like to contribute to the church's food bank, you bring a canned good.
