"It was NOT flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven" So often in life we 'know' somebody – but only on a surface level and nothing deeper. We meet them often, travel with them – but, really, we do not know them. Peter possibly had the same experience of Jesus. He walked with Him, listened to Him and saw the miracles he performed...but, like others, did not really know Him. Peter wasn't alone in 'wondering'! When Jesus finally asked his disciples the question, a lot of different answers were offered. *"But YOU"*, he said, *"who do YOU say I am?"* Peter was not sure where the words came from, but suddenly he realised who Jesus was and what His teaching was about. – *"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."* This revelation to Peter was a GIFT from God.

There are many ways, many opportunities to LEARN about God. We can read books, watch TV programmes, listen to DVDs. But if all that happens is that we learn facts and listen to opinions, then it may be the case that we know *about* God – but do we really *know* God? Can we take a step further? Can we progress from knowing *about* God – to *knowing* God? It is something we can only do with God's help. God has shown us the way in Jesus. Are we willing to journey with him, NOT as strangers but AS friends?

PLEASE BE AWARE

<u>It is essential</u> to be at the church <u>15 minutes</u> before mass starts, so that a steward can show you where to sit.

<u>Please enter</u> the church in the normal way and <u>exit</u> through the double doors at the rear of the church.

<u>Importan</u>t: Please <u>sanitise</u> your hands on entry into the church. Refrain from touching anything in the porch.

<u>There</u> will be no missals or hymn books and therefore no congregational singing during mass.

There will be no sign of peace.

Kneelers in the pews should not be used.

<u>Receiving Communion:</u> Please remain seated until directed by a steward to proceed. <u>Communion</u> can only be taken in the hand with your arms outstretched to the full so that there is the required distance between you and the priest.

<u>Important</u>: <u>At Communion</u> after the response: 'Lord I am not worthy....' the priest will hold up the Host to the congregation and say "THE BODY OF CHRIST" to which the people respond "AMEN". In the same way the people say "AMEN" after he has elevated the Chalice. This enables the people's Communion to be distributed in silence with no dialogue, as they have already acclaimed the presence of the Lord.

<u>There</u> will be <u>collection baskets</u> for Offertory Collection at the entrance and exit from the church.

<u>Please</u> disperse as quickly as possible after mass.

Those attending Mass/ Services in Churches should limit their interactions with anyone they are not attending church with, i.e. if they are attending corporate worship with one other household, wherever possible they should maintain social distancing with anyone outside of this group.

FACE MASKS are now compulsory in churches and places of worship. Face coverings are to be worn in enclosed public spaces at all times.

They are also currently mandatory on public transport and shops and in supermarkets.

ST. AUGUSTINE

This famous son of St. Monica was born in Africa and spent many years of his life in wicked living and in false beliefs. Though he was one of the most intelligent men who ever lived and though he had been brought up a Christian, he could not see or understand the Divine Truth. Through the prayers of his holy mother and the marvellous preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine finally became convinced that Christianity was the one true religion. Yet he did not become a Christian then, because he thought he could never live a pure life. One day, he picked up the book of the Letters of St. Paul and read the first passage his gaze fell on. It was just what Augustine needed, for in it, St. Paul says to put away all impurity and to live in imitation of Jesus. That did it!

From then on, Augustine began a new life. He was baptized, became a priest, a bishop, a famous Christian writer and one of the greatest saints that ever lived. He became very devout and charitable, too. On the wall of his room he had the following sentence written in large letters: "Here we do not speak evil of anyone." St. Augustine overcame strong heresies, practised great poverty and supported the poor, preached very often and prayed with great fervour right up until his death. "Too late have I loved You!" he once cried to God, but with his holy life he certainly made up for the sins he committed before his conversion. His feast day is August 28th. His complete turnaround and conversion has been an inspiration to many who struggle with a particular vice or habit they long to break.

The Augustinians, an international Religious Order of Catholic friars and priests, also known as the Order of St. Augustine, was established in 1244. The friars took St. Augustine as their spiritual founder and his 'Rule' and way of life as a guide for living in community.
