




LEADER'S MESSAGE

At this time of year when we have so much, let us share with those who have needs. Our club has made a donation to a charity each Christmas and with your help will also make a sizeable contribution this year. Thank you for Giving.



These 4 charities were selected because they do not receive grants or federal funding.

<u>Mutual Aid Partners</u> – This is a grassroots community-led nonprofit focused on providing resources and support to families in need. It started in 2020 during the pandemic, but is now committed to nurturing sustainable projects that lower barriers and create positive change. They also collaborate with other community organizations. They provide food, clothing, vaccinations for pets, pet food, haircuts, and more every Tuesday at noon in the Unitarian Church parking lot on Ouray across from the library.

<u>Solidarity Not Charity</u> – This is also a grassroots-oriented community nonprofit focused on providing resources, including food and clean drinking water, for homeless people living outside. Not charity because people receiving services are encouraged to contribute ideas and resources of their own.

<u>The Joseph Center</u> was created about five years ago mainly to support children but has now expanded to support families who are in danger of becoming homeless and who need help with parenting. Its mission is to provide hope, establish stability, encourage resourcefulness, and confer a sense of belonging in our community. They provide clothing, daily hot meals, a food pantry, and help with filling out job applications and finding affordable housing.

<u>Child and Migrant Services</u> is a nonprofit organization that serves guest farm workers during the growing season. It provides clothing, food, hygiene products, English classes, and more.




