#### **Guide Hall**

For the past few years we have been pushing the Shire to carry out remedial work on the Youth (Guide) Hall located in The Crescent. At long last there is a documented review from the Shire which lists three options. The Ratepayers Group supports option I (renovation) and trust the Shire can push through the bureaucratic paperwork and get this project moving. We are aware that numerous local tradies are more than happy to help with the project and are ready to go.

We have asked Councillor Mercurio to meet with us to discuss this project. We don't need to lose this building which is part of Tyabb's history and made possible by many of the area's early families.

Schools have reopened for the year so let's show patience with the rise in morning and afternoon traffic and students near the roads. Don't forget the 40kph school zones.

As there are still many people with and without dogs walking the footpaths and nature reserves such as Clifford Drive Bushland Reserve and Olivers Creek Reserve, a gentle reminder that these are both 'dog on leash' areas, along with all footpaths and roads. Also, remember to pick up your dog poo and dispose of it in the proper manner. We are still working with the Shire to have doggie doo bag dispensers installed around town.

Bearing in mind the generally drier weather, with regards to the new housing development, *Spindrift*, at 1485 Frankston/Flinders Road, take caution with the dust hazard during days of high winds. It should be the responsibility of the contractors to keep dust levels under control by watering; if this isn't happening contact the Shire. We are interested in pursuing with the Shire the best route for the bike path trail through Somerville and Baxter. We are also asking for general maintenance on the path between Somerville and Hastings which needs tree pruning as was done recently on the nature

The hoons are continuing to leave their mark around town and further afield. If you hear or see such activity call the Police or Crime Stoppers. Now that there is more road traffic back on the road I am baffled by motorists travelling on the freeways who feel they need to slow down by anything up to 30kms or more below the speed limit when they see a car parked on the side of the road, perhaps fearing that it may be a 'radar camera car'. If it is an emergency vehicle with lights flashing, yes you must pass at 40kph, but providing you are not exceeding the speed limit then there should not be a problem. Keep the traffic moving!

We have contacted Councillor Paul Mercurio to arrange a meeting to discuss various projects of interest around the town and are awaiting possible dates that may be mutually suitable.

#### Fire Restrictions



The Fire Danger Period is when CFA restricts the use of fire in the community. This is to help prevent fires from starting. CFA declares the Fire Danger Period for each Shire or Council at different times in the lead up to the fire season. It depends on the amount of rain, grassland curing rate and other local conditions

To be certain that you are able to burn off check with Council, not forgetting that different rules apply to different sized properties.

The Fire Danger Period for Tyabb is between December and May

## Caring for our community



### during Coronavirus

Summer is well underway and we would like to take this opportunity to thank our locals and visitors for staying COVID-safe and following restrictions during the busy holiday period.

Keep looking after your health by wearing a mask where required, getting tested and staying home if you have symptoms. When you're out and about remember to slip, slop, slap and slide 1.5 metres away from anyone not in your group.

### How to wear a face mask

There are two types of face masks you can use: cloth masks and surgical masks. Cloth masks are made of washable fabric and can be re-used.

Wearing a face mask protects you and your community by providing an additional physical barrier to coronavirus (COVID-19).



Wash your hands before putting on the mask.



Make sure it covers your nose and mouth and fits snugly under your chin, over the bridge of your nose and against the sides of your face.



Do not touch the front of the mask while wearing it.

If you do touch the mask, wash or sanitise your hands immediately. Do not allow the mask to hang around your neck.

To remove the mask wash or sanitise your hands first.



Carefully remove your mask by grasping the ear loops or untying the ties. For masks with a pair of ties, unfasten the bottom one first, then the top one.

If your mask has filters, remove them and throw them away.

Fold the mask and put it directly into the laundry or into a disposable or washable bag for laundering. Single use surgical masks should be disposed of responsibly.



Wash or sanitise your hands after removing the mask.

### What you need to keep doing

- Wash your hands regularly
- Keep 1.5 metres from others
- · Get tested, even if you have mild symptoms
- Stay home if you're feeling unwell.
