

Murder in the Cathedral

That's the title of a play about the death of St Thomas Becket, and I read in The Tablet this week that the British Museum has "a terrific exhibition on Thomas Becket". I wonder how long it will continue.

More importantly, Pope Francis has created a new lay ministry of the Catechist. It's a natural progression in the Pope's desire to encourage the greater participation of lay men and -women in the leadership of the Catholic Church, but he's merely giving formal recognition to a ministry that has been part of the life of the Church for centuries. He has deliberately called his letter "Ancient Ministry" (Antiquum Ministerium). Lay people have acted as partners with bishops and priests in the transmission and growth of the faith and the building up of the Church from apostolic times.

Catechesis has grown out of the revelation of God's self-communication, emphasising the need for it to be based on Christ and on Scripture, doctrine and liturgy, since these are the ways we can stay connected to God.
