Rules -

-Keep it Simple - The flag should be simple enough that a child can draw it from memory.

 -Use Meaningful Symbols to the City of Connellsville - The flag's images, colors, or patterns should relate to what it symbolizes.

-Use 2-3 Basic Colors - Limit the number of colors on the flag to three, which contrast well and come from the standard color set (red, blue, green, black, yellow, and white)

-No Lettering or Seals - Never use writing of any kind or an organization's seal.

-Be distinctive and Be related to the City of Connellsville - Avoid duplicating other flags, but use similarities to show connections.

-Contest open to Elementary through High School Students located in the Connellsville Area School District.

-Submissions must be tuned in to the Appalachian Creativity Center located at 139 West Crawford Avenue NLT March 15.

-Connelisville City Council will pick two designs, during the March 16th City Council Meeting. One as a winner and one as a second runner up.

All posters submitted will be on display in the windows of participating downtown businesses after the selection
of winner and second runner up.

-Winner will receive a \$50 gift card and the second runner up will receive a \$25 gift card from a downtown business.

This contest is just for fun and is in no way a solicitation for a flag design for the City of Connellsville.

Springfield Township Elementary

1991 saw the untimely death of the district's first and longtime Superintendent of Schools, Clifford N. Pritts. As a honorable gesture, the Board of Education named the Saltlick Elementary School in his honor in 1991 as he was instrumental in the efforts of a consolidated school in Saltlick Township. A modern roof was added to the school shortly after the name change, however the school would be a casualty of district reorganization in 2017 with the students being absorbed into the more modern Springfield elementary school. As a result of a condition of the naming of the fomer Saltlick school, the name of the newly-consolidated school in the Indian Creek Valley was changed to Springfield-Clifford N. Pritts Elementary School.

Springfield Clifford N Pritts Elementary School is located in the mountain area of Connellsville Area School District. The school provides education services for students in grades kindergarten through the fifth grade. Currently, Springfield has an enrollment of approximately 355 students with an average class size of 20 students.








Dunbar Township Elementary
