1st/2nd: This week will be a review week for spelling words for first and second grade. Both classes will have 30 words this week, so they need to practice more than ever. Spelling tests will be Friday. We will be working on a few Veteran's Day projects this week and discussing the importance of veterans. First grade has a math test on Tuesday and a science test on Wednesday. Science study guides will go home today. Second grade will have a math test on Friday. Reminder: All students need to read AR books for their AR tests. Several students haven't started reading to meet 2nd quarter requirements. I hope everyone has a great week. — Mrs. Hird

3rd/4th: Tomorrow we will be back in person and hopefully we can bounce right back into our routine. With that being said, all work that was sent home will be due tomorrow morning. Our class is going to pick up where we left off. Both classes will have math tests tomorrow. They will also take a spelling test over last week's words. Third grade will have a science test over chapter 4 on Wednesday. Students should have been studying their study guides over the past week. Both grades will also have a social studies test on Thursday over week 7 of their Missouri Studies Weekly. Study

5th/6th: 5th and 6th graders will continue working on poetry this week. In Science, 5th grade will be finishing a chapter over "The Water Cycle" and 6th grade will finish a chapter over the "States of Matter". In Reading, students will continue in their Lit. Circle book "The Egypt Game". In Social Studies, 5th grade will continue learning about the "Revolutionary War" and 6th grade will begin working on Native American dioramas and poster projects.

7/8 Comm. Arts: Students will be finishing their poems and will continue reading in their Lit. Circle book "The Witch of Blackbird Pond". 2nd Quarter AR Requirements for 5th-8th grade are due Fri., December 10th. Have a wonderful week! - Mrs. Foster

5/6 Math: This week finds 5th graders practicing their skills with protractors to measure angles, using number lines and rulers to learn about fractions and mixed numbers and looking at quadrilateral characteristics. In sixth grade, students are working on division of and by decimals, mental division by powers of 10, and data displays.

Tests This Week: 6th Math: Wednesday

7/8: This week marks the end of the mid-quarter, so I encourage everybody to finish strong. In grammar, seventh and eighth graders are finishing up a unit on verbs. This will include subject/verb agreement and predicate nouns and adjectives. In science, seventh grade will continue on with their unit on weather and climate, specifically climate zone characteristics and zones. Eighth grade will begin a unit on cells, heredity, and classification.
