# Writing Tips

"Writing a novel is like driving at night: You can see only as far as your headlights, but you can make your whole journey that way"

-- E. L. Doctorow

This quote hit home for me this week. I'm writing my 4th novel, and I know my destination, but I need to take each segment of the trip in chunks. And my characters are starting to hear me and shape up. I'm talking to you, Humphrey.

"Make your characters memorable." This is a tip from Writer's Relief. Great characters will keep readers turning pages. Think of Charles Dickens' book **Great Expectations**. The personalities

jump off the page and make you love 'em or hate 'em. Kurt Vonnegut agreed when he said, "Use the time of a total stranger in such a way that he or she will not feel the time was wasted."

Writer's Relief also suggests that writing prompts are a great way to get out of the doldrums and the ho-hum of your writing. The WGA offers writing prompts every other month (when we are meeting regularly) and they are a great way to kick off new ideas and get the creative juices flowing. Writer's Digest magazine will also send you writing prompts for a year if you sign up.

#### Screenwriting

Are any of our readers writing screenplays, teleplays, or scripts? I have written a few, back in the early 1990's, but I think times and requirements have changed since then. Writer's Digest pointed me to a website called scriptmag.com and an article "Comedy Writing: Fine-Tuning Flaws to Make Characters Timely." It was very interesting, pulling in examples from modern movies and TV shows.

Without copy/pasting the entire article, I will summarize in one sentence. Maybe two. You can derive humor in situations by having one or more (or all) of your characters possess psychological flaws that the viewer will recognize. This can be done walking that line between timely subjects and dangerously controversial topics.

Does your main character possess a flaw in his/her personality? Does that drive the main problem in the story? Does the character realize and correct the flaw in the end, or does it remain part of him/her for the next story? Fun, isn't it? Creating a world and then tweaking it. I love writing.
