The Friendship Force of Shelby has 51 members who are eager to host. The membership is made up of mostly of retires, but is always seeking younger members.


About the region







FRIENDSHIP DAY is March 1, 2021

March 1, 2021 marks the 44th anniversary of the founding of Friendship Force International, a non-profit organization that has brought together more than 1 million people in homestays since 1977 to share different views and discover common ground, in a quest for global understanding and peace.

On that special day in March, 1977 FFI was created by Wayne Smith and endorsed by President Jimmy Carter.

The mission from the beginning was to promote global understanding across the barriers that separate people.

In past years, FFI clubs all over the world have celebrated this special day. Looking back on March 9, 2017 our club celebrated Friendship Day with the CMU international students. The students hosted the event on CMU campus. We introduced our organization to the students with a presentation and photos of journeys hosted by our club and out-going journeys to other countries.

Western Colorado Friendship Force club was founded in 1982. The club has hosted over 38 in-coming journeys and over 29 out-going journeys to other countries. These opportunities have been life changing to all members.


Many of our members have received their vaccines and are eager to cautiously venture out and mingle more.
