

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Mama Mia Family Night turned out to be very successful. The event brought in over \$5,700 in net profit. This was the final fundraiser for the 2015-16 school year. Our total fund raisers brought in \$23,670. Awesome job Coyote Ridge Families!

As of our March General Meeting, total YTD expenses are \$35,990 while total YTD income is \$51,002. Major expenses

since our last newsletter include: Mama Mia Family Night \$2,241; classroom enrichment \$834; field trip funding \$760; Touch of Understanding \$2,000, Bingo Night \$293; and communication and copies \$458. Major source of income since the last newsletter include: Mama Mia Family Night \$8,203; Target \$1,519; and eScript \$402.

FOOD ALLERGY AWARENESS MONTH

Every May, FARE (Food Allergy Research & Education) hosts a nationwide Food Allergy Awareness Week to shine a spotlight on the seriousness of food allergies and to improve public understanding of this potentially life-threatening medical condition. By increasing awareness, we can encourage respect, promote safety, and improve the quality of life of the 15 million Americans affected by food allergies and anaphylaxis. This year's Food Allergy Awareness Week is May 8-14 and the theme is "Food Allergies: React with Respect".

A food allergy reaction sends someone to the ER every 3 minutes. It could happen to one of your friends, family members or coworkers. Sometimes food allergies are mocked or made light of in the media and in real life. The goal of Food Allergy Awareness Week is to help inform the public about the serious

consequences of food allergy reactions, as well as how to identify symptoms and respond in case of an emergency.
