"THIS TEXT IS BEING FULFILLED TODAY EVEN AS YOU LISTEN"

Today's passage from St. Lukes Gospel shows Jesus proclaiming the word of God. In the synagogue at Nazareth, he makes his own this passage from Isaiah, and uses it to announce a programme for his ministry. He is sent, not to the wealthy or the powerful, but to the poor and the lowly, the oppressed and the suffering. Here we see Luke's concern for the poor and the afflicted. These are ALL the dispossessed of this world, and those who are waiting for liberation. The Good News must not be limited to spiritual blessings only. But the poor are also those who live on bread alone and who never hear the Word of God. Jesus didn't merely announce the good News and leave it at that. He began to make it a reality. At the root of innumerable wrongs in our world is the discrepancy between word and deed. It is a weakness of Churches, Parties and individuals. This was the main fault Jesus found with the Pharisees: '*They do not practice wha they preach.*' '*My life is my message*' said Gandhi.
