From the Deacons' Bench

My 37 year-old daughter Sarah was admitted to the Cardiac Care Unit at Hartford Hospital with a mystery illness producing severe chest pain and damage to her heart muscle (heart attack) - attacks continued for two more days. This time of testing, uncertainty about diagnosis and proper treatment was beyond nerve-wracking.

I found myself anxious and worried - Would my daughter get through this? When would the pain stop? Would her life be changed forever? I found myself praying about all my worries which left me unfulfilled - and more anxious than ever.

A phone call from Pastor Pat changed all that. She shared a healing prayer that restored my daughter and me. I asked God to shine his light on Sarah and through Sarah - to find and heal those damaged areas, and restore her mind and spirit. It ended with blessing her medical team and care- givers. Every time a worry crept in, I said this healing prayer. I told my daughter what I was doing, and called her nightly to say it with her.

From the first healing prayer onward, Sarah was free of chest pain and spared further heart damage. There were bumps in the road, but she came home several days later - with a diagnosis and treatment plan that would restore her health completely.

This experience has changed my perspective. I now pray knowing that God is present and acting in my life, knowing that my prayers will be answered, experiencing prayer as an expression of faith. Thank you Pastor Pat for the gift of healing prayer.
